



India-U.K. defence, trade ties to get a booster shot

U.K. likely to offer series of technological collaborations

In the backdrop of the rapid geopolitical turmoil, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his British counterpart Boris Johnson on Friday agreed on a new and expanded India-U.K. defence partnership and vowed to seal an ambitious free trade agreement by the end of the year.

After his wide-ranging talks with Mr. Modi on the second and final day of his India visit, Mr. Johnson said the U.K. is creating an Open General Export Licence (OGEL) for India to "reduce bureaucracy and slashing delivery times" for defence procurement.

The British Prime Minister said both sides agreed to work together to meet new threats across land, sea, air space and cyber domains and the U.K. will partner with India on new fighter jet technology as well as in the

maritime sphere to detect and respond to threats.

'A beacon in stormy seas'

"Our collaboration on the issues that matter to both our countries, from climate change to energy security and defence, is of vital importance as we look to the future. I look forward to discussing these issues with Prime Minister Modi in New Delhi today and working together to deliver a more secure and prosperous future for both our peoples," said Mr. Johnson in his first statement after a ceremonial welcome at Rashtrapati Bhavan.

GRMB meet postponed again

It was first rescheduled on March 11 due to lack of quorum

The meeting of Godavari River Management Board (GRMB) scheduled for Friday has been postponed against for want of quorum as members from Andhra Pradesh did not turn up. The 13 th meeting of the Board has been postponed twice now as it could not be held on March 11, also due to lack of quorum.

Member Secretary of the Board R. Azhagesan read the rule position and stated that the meeting could not be held due to lack of quorum and Chairman M.P. Singh may take a decision for rescheduling it again, as members of the Board and members representing Telangana turned up. Technical Member and Engineer-in-Chief (General) of Telangana C. Muralidhar requested the Chairman to convene the meeting at shortest possible time as the rescheduled meeting could not be held.

Apart from discussing three detailed project reports (DPRs) of Telangana - Chanakha-Korata, Choutpally Hanmanth Reddy and Kaleshwaram additional one-tmc ft capacity state - the meeting was also supposed to take up two DPRs of AP - Venkatanagaram pump house and Uttarandhra Sujala Srayanthi - for approval.

Besides, budget-related issues of GRMB were also on the agenda for resolving them at the earliest. From the Board's side, the matter of ₹200 crore each seed money deposit by the two Member States and getting approvals for all unapproved projects under implementation by July 14, the time extended by the Ministry of Jal Shakti, were expected to be taken up at the meeting.

Engineer-in-Chief (Kaleshwaram) N. Venkateshwarlu, OSD to Chief Minister and GRMB Sub-Committee member Sridhar Rao Deshpande, Chief Engineers R. Madhusudhana Rao (Nizamabad), G. Srinivas Reddy (Adilabad) and Mohan Kumar (ISWR) and Superintending Engineer R. Koteshwar Rao from Telangana turned up for the meeting.

Godavari River Management Board (GRMB) was constituted by the Central Government as an autonomous body under the administrative control of the Central Government in pursuance of the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act, 2014 (6 of 2014) for the administration, regulation, maintenance and operation of such projects, as may be notified by the Central Government from time to time. In exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-sections (1), (4) and (5) of the Section 85 of Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation the Act, 2014, the Central Government constituted Godavari River Management Board vide Ministry of Water Resources, RD & GR Gazette Notification – S.O. 1403(E), dated the 28th May, 2014. The Headquarter of GRMB is located at Hyderabad.

NIA files chargesheet against two in espionage case

One of the accused is a Pakistani national

The Hyderabad unit of National Investigation Agency on Friday filed a chargesheet against two persons, including a Pakistan national, in an espionage case in Andhra Pradesh for their involvement in conspiracy and espionage activities with an intention to wage war against India.

The accused are Altafhussen Ganchibhai (27) alias Shakil from Godhra in Panchamahal district of Gujarat and Waseem from Karachi, Pakistan

While Altafhussen Ganchibhai was booked under Sections 18 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act and 120 B, 121A of the Indian Penal Code and 66C of Information Technology Act, Waseem was booked under Sections 17 and 18 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act and 120B, 121A of the Indian Penal Code.

The case was originally registered on January 10, 2020, by the Counter Intelligence Cell of Andhra Pradesh police, Vijayawada, and was reregistered by the NIA on December 23, 2021, pertaining to criminal conspiracy to carry out anti-national activities by Pakistani agents for obtaining crucial and sensitive information pertaining to Defense establishments from Indian Armed Forces personnel by engaging civilians as their agents using Social Media Platforms like Facebook, WhatsApp, Instagram etc.

The investigation by the NIA has revealed that Altafhussen Ganchibhai, on directions of Pakistan-based handlers had clandestinely activated WhatsApp by passing on OTPs received on Indian SIM numbers to his handlers in Pakistan for collection/transmission of sen-

sitive information pertaining to Indian Defense forces and establishments.

"These SIM cards were subscribed in the name of Indian fishermen from Gujarat who were earlier arrested by Pakistan Maritime Security Agency in 2020 when they were fishing in the high seas," the NIA officials said.

The agency established that these SIM cards were illegally routed back to India to the arrested accused Altafhusen Ganchibhai, who activated seven such SIM cards under the direction of his handlers in Pakistan.

He was arrested on October 25, 2021. Waseem, who is currently at large, had routed money clandestinely through online Cryptocurrency exchange platforms to Indian agents for eliciting sensitive and classified information pertaining to vital Indians Defense establishments.

"There is a fear that the ISRO is about to be sold off. It runs fully on government funding, which means the limit of government funding will be the limit of our growth. But if private companies come in, it will expand the space economy,"

Centre, Thumba, confirmed. RLV-LEX involves taking an unmanned, winged prototype to an altitude of 2.3 km to 2.4 km on a helicopter and releasing it to land at a Defence Research Development Organisation airstrip at Chitradurga, Karnataka.

"The prototype will be released 3.7 km away from the airstrip and it must travel the distance autonomously, gain velocity, maintain control and come in like any typical aircraft, touching down with the rear wheels first. A parachute will then be deployed for braking," he said.

Cheaper access to space is what makes an RLV attractive. A major hurdle in space exploration is the prohibitive cost, which can be slashed if the launch vehicle is a reusable one. The RLV-TD programme comprises a series of experimental missions aimed at making India's dream of owning a reusable, two-stage-to-orbit vehicle come true.

Rajnath rolls out schemes for defence start-ups

'Opportunity to understand new technologies'

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Friday launched Innovations for Defence Excellence (iDEX) Prime and the sixth Defence India Start-up Challenge (DISC-6) meant to encourage defence start-ups during DefConnect 2.0. The iDEX-Prime aims to support projects, requiring support beyond ₹1.5 crore up to ₹10 crore, to help the ever-growing start-ups in the sector, the Defence Ministry said.

"The iDEX has provided an opportunity to our science and technology professionals to understand futuristic technologies such as AI, Augmented Reality, block-chain and space technologies. The start-up ecosystem has also been promoted and encouraged through order placement," Mr. Singh said. He noted that he iDEX has, so far, introduced more than 100 win-

ners to the market, providing direct & indirect employment to thousands of skilled and semi-skilled

The DISC-6 with 38 problem statements was also launched by Mr. Singh which relate to Artificial Intelligence (AI), advanced imaging, sensor systems, among others.

Mr. Singh stressed on continuous strengthening of all sectors, especially the security apparatus, to deal with the challenges that may emanate from the fast-changing world order.

Stating that every new

threat is becoming more complex and challenging than the previous one, Mr. Singh said, "After the CO-VID-19 pandemic, the world is now witnessing the Ukrainian conflict. We have also witnessed instability in the Middle East (West Asia), in Afghanistan and now in Pakistan. One way or the other, such events impact our country as well. There is a need to equip the country in every area to ensure peace and stability. The development of disruptive technology is a key requirement to handle new threats and challenges of the future."

Allowances for armed forces, CAPF now on par

Correcting an anomaly linked to the existing difference in risk and hardship allowance between the armed forces and Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF), the Defence Ministry has brought military personnel on a par with their CAPF counterparts. This was announced by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh at the Army Commanders' Conference on Thursday.

A case to increase the same was taken up by the Department of Defence in March 2019 and by the Department of Military Affairs in March 2020, defence officials said.

"After due deliberations, it was submitted by the then Chairman of the Chiefs of Staff Committee to the Defence Minister where it was subsequently approved," an official said The allowance will be admissible retrospectively from February 22, 2019, and the approximate cash outgo for the government is ₹10,000 crore.

It is also admissible to National Cadet Corps units, training centres, Border Roads Organisation, Military Engineer Services (MES).

In addition, 40% of the personnel posted to Strategic Forces Command (SFC) will be paid allowance in the revised matrix, which is ₹10,500 for Officers and ₹6,000 for Junior Commissioned Officers.

In case if there is any reduction in the revised allowance in any particular location, then the existing allowance would continue and also if any location has been inadvertently left out in the annexure, the existing allowance would continue, officials added.
