Tamil Nadu has 2272 police stations, the highest in the country, followed by Uttar Pradesh (1656) and Maharashtra (1165).



KARNATAKA SIGNED a memorandum of understanding (MoU)with Israel-based ISMC Analog Fab Private Ltd for setting up the country's first semiconductor fab plant with an investment of around Rs 22,900 crore (\$3 billion).

The company is set to fully implement the project over the next 7 years with employment potential for 1,500 people. Additional Chief Secretary in the Department of IT, BT Dr EV Ramana Reddy on the part of Karnataka and ISMC director Ajay Jalan signed the MoU.

In a major industrial boost to Mysuru, ISMC has requested 150 acres of land in Mysuru's Kochanahalli Industrial area. This will be India's first and largest semiconductor fabrication unit under the Centre's Indian Semiconduction Mission. The MoU with ISMC will make Karnataka the place to look forward to in semiconductor technology, Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai said in his address, after signing of the MoU.

Karnataka government understands that it is not just the concessions or incentives, it is the conducive ecosystem that is needed to draw the investors. The state has the best infrastructure and skilled human resources, Bommai said.

It is a major stride in the semiconductor sector. There are challenges ahead. The MoU would drive us to turn those challenges into opportunities, Bommai said.

The MoU has provided a forum for technology and cultural exchange between Israel and India, Bommai added, requesting ISMC to not just to set up the plant here, but also bring the latest developments in the technology as it evolves with time to this plant in Karnataka.

Early 2021 reforms to quicken pace of key Sagarmala projects

House panel finds progress slow in port modernisation; today's ministerial meet may unveil action plan

AN INTER-MINISTERIAL COM-MITTEE headed by minister for shipping & waterways Sar-bananda Sonowal will meet in New Delhi on Friday, to take stock of the progress of the seven-year-old, ₹5.54-trillion Sagarmala project, aimed at slashing logistics costs for both domestic and export-import cargo

The meeting is in the backdrop of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's just-concluded visit to north Europe, where he invited Nordic companies to invest in India's Blue Economy sector, especially in the Sagarmala project. While it is clear that Sagar-


mala, one of the flagship projects of the Narendra Modi government, has helped reduce the turnaround time at India's ports to an average of around 27 hours now, from around 45 hours before the project's launch, private investments in key areas like port modernisation and development of new ports have been much below expectations. Since these two critical areas haven't witnessed adequate investor interest, portled industrialisation has not made much headway either.

As far as the Indian economy's competitiveness is concerned, logistical constraints have been a big drag, along with the rigid labour market.

A parliamentary panel has recently highlighted the slow progress in port projects.

The Parliament in February 2021 passed the Major Ports Authority Bill, 2020, to abolish the Tariff Authority for Major Ports (TAMP), and give the boards of every port the powers to fix reference tariffs for various port services; this could enthuse private investors. Thanks to this crucial reform, and since the Covid-19 pandemic has abated, private-public partnership (PPP) projects in various port services may finally get a leg up now.

According to analysts, the "major-ports sector" (govern-



ment-run ports) hasn't seen the required level of fixed assets creation owing to legacy issues, including the TAMP's archaic

regulatory grip. In January 2018, the Cabinet took a slew of steps to spur private investments via the PPP route in state-run ports. It allowed investors to share rovalty with the port authorities on discounted tariffs, rather than as a percentage of gross revenue based on tariff ceiling fixed by the regulator at the time of bid ding. Other steps announced then included easier exit, akin to what investors in highway projects enjoy; immunity from post-model concession agree ment threat to project viability from regulatory orders, changes in environmental and labour aws, and imposition of or hikes in indirect taxes.

According to a statement issued by the ministry of shipping & ports on Wednesday, of the total 802 projects envisaged under Sagarmala, as many as 202 projects, worth ₹99,281 crore, have been completed. Another 216 projects worth ₹2.12 trillion are under implementation and 384 projects worth ₹2.37 trillion are under various stages of development.

After a hiatus caused by the pandemic, some Sagarmala projects have gathered momentum in recent months. According to sources, 21 projects have got completed in the last couple of months, taking the total number of completed projects to 202.

The potential for port-led development and easing of cargo movement at Indian ports is big, given the country's 7,500km long coastline and 14,500 km of navigable waterways.

The parliamentary panel that reviewed the Sagarmala project in its report released in late March found "unsatisfactory progress" under three broad heads -- port modernisation &

port development. new enhancement of port connectivity and port-led industrialisation. A total of 483 projects involving investment of ₹5.17 trillion, or a little over 93% of the projected investment under the entire Sagarmala programme, has been conceived under these three heads.

"The port modernisation ogramme, which constitutes ₹2.6 trillion, or 47% of the programme, had a rather slow progress last fiscal. While 76 of the 242 port modernisation projects were completed till 2020-21 since the launch of the programme, just one additional project was completed last fiscal," the panel noted.

The pace of work under the port connectivity enhancement programme, under which ₹1.36 trillion is being spent, has been even slower, it added.

"Despite the enormous importance of the connectivity of ports, the committee feels that the pace of work under this head has been even slower than that under modernisation of ports, since out of 208 projects only 56 have been completed and 69 are under implementation. Out of the ₹1.36 trillion funding under this head, only a paltry sum of ₹19,488 crore has been utilised till date in completed projects. The committee also notes that there appears to be very few connectivity projects relating to minor ports," the committee said.

"The committee is constrained to note that despite the importance of industrialisation around the ports, not much work appears to have been done under this head. The committee, therefore, recommends to expedite implementation of port-led industrialisation proects and set globally benchmarked targets to improve logistics efficiency and cost competitiveness," said the panel in its report.

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Govt to launch e-commerce network in 100 cities

NEW DELHI: The government plans to roll out its indigenously developed online e-commerce network for the public in 100 Indian cities by Diwali to provide millions of kirana stores and consumers an alternative to multinational platforms such as Amazon and Flipkart.

Union commerce and industry minister Piyush Goyal on Friday announced the test-launch of the open-source system. The beta launch will unveil the IT applications of the Open Network for Digital Commerce (ONDC) and registry covering a small number of retailers and customers initially in Bengaluru on Friday, two people directly associated with the project said. "After UPI (Unified Payment

Interface), another game changing idea to democratise com-

merce - ONDC soft launch today to select consumers, sellers and logistics providers. Get ready for a world of choice, convenience and transparency," the minister said in a tweet on Friday.

The project is massive as it will provide a wide choice to all consumers and retailers and the formal launch will take place after successful testing of the system, said Anil Agrawal, the additional secretary in the department for promotion of industry and internal trade (DPIIT).

"End-to-end testing is being done to create a playbook with an aim to launch it in 100 cities in six months [by October 2022]," he said.

About 15 restaurants and grocery stores have been registered in Bangalore along with select consumers to begin the trial with actual delivery of products, ONDC chief executive officer Thampy Koshy said in Bengaluru on Friday.

"This is the field trial with real transactions. In the coming week, we will cover two big and three smaller cities. Based on the experience, we will gradually scale it up," he said.

The ONDC system is different

from the operational models of existing e-commerce companies in India and abroad where buyers and sellers are restricted to their respective platforms, Koshy said.

"Our model is platform-agnostic. This is unique, it's never been done anywhere in the world. Hence, a considered approach," he said.

"ONDC is based on interoperability where all platforms will talk to each other," Koshy said.

The system will have multiple choices for both retailers and customers in terms of cataloguing, inventories, warehousing, suppliers, logistics and payments, he said. The initial test launch, which was started in Bengaluru, will also cover cities such as Delhi, Coimbatore, Bhopal and Shillong.

Amazon India said they are "closely engaging with the ONDC team to better understand the proposed model". "We remain committed to the government's vision of digitizing kiranas, local stores and creating opportunities for businesses across India by simplifying technology adoption to help local stores and businesses contribute to India becoming a \$5 trillion economy. We are closely engaging with the ONDC team to better understand the proposed model and evaluate the role Amazon can play to better serve Indian customers and sellers," an Amazon India spokesperson said.

Flipkart did not respond to email queries on this matter.

Experts who wish not to be named said the ONDC model may also have some challenges such as the return policy, which is currently the responsibility of the e-commerce platforms.

The other challenge could be related to consumer grievance redressal.

Nitish opens India's 1st greenfield grain-based ethanol plant in Bihar

BIHAR CHIEF Minister Nitish Kumar on Saturday opened the country's first greenfield grainbased ethanol plant in Purnea and said ethanol production will help reduce cost of petrol and generate employment.

The Rs 105-crore plant by Eastern India Biofuels Pvt Ltd is the first one developed since the Centre gave a go-ahead to Bihar's ethanol production and promotion policy-2021.

Nitish said on the occasion: "We have made a start. We had been trying this since 2007. We had requested the then UPA government to give us the go-ahead when we received proposals for setting up ethanol units.... Now, 20 per cent ethanol can be mixed with petrol and diesel. The country will benefit immensely from ethanol production."

State Industry minister Syed Shahnawaz Hussain added: "Oil Marketing Companies



With 18 of 38 Bihar's districts falling in what is known as the corn belt, the state government has proposed opening at least 17 ethanol plants over the next two years. The state expects opening more such plants to benefit farmers, and the factories to generate employment for locals, especially in the Seemanchal belt comprising Purnea, Kishanganj, Katihar and Araria districts.





Highest sex ratio at birth in Ladakh



NEW DELMI Ladakh recorded the highest sex ratio at birth in the country in 2020, followed by Arunachal Pradesh, Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Tripura and Kerala, according to the annual report on Vital Statistics based on 2020 Civil Registration System report.

"Highest Sex Ratio at Birth (SRB) based on registered events has been reported by Ladakh (1,104) followed by Arunachal Pradesh (1,011), A&N Islands (984), Tripura (974), and Kerala (969)," the report released by the Registrar-General of India on Tuesday said. Sex ratio at birth is the number of females per thousand males.

The lowest sex ratio was reported by Manipur (880), followed by Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu



(898), Gujarat (909), Haryana (916) and Madhya Pradesh (921).

2019 data

In 2019, the highest sex ratio at birth was reported by Arunachal Pradesh (1,024), followed by Nagaland (1,001), Madhya Pradesh (921) Mizoram (975) and A&N Islands (965), and the lowest sex ratio was reported by Gujarat (901), Assam (903), Madhya Pradesh (905) and Jammu & Kashmir (909).

The report said that the requisite information from Maharashtra, Sikkim, Uttar Pradesh and Delhi on sex ratio was "not available." They had not provided the said data in 2019 as well.

"The sex ratio at birth of registered events is an important indicator to map the sex differential of the population at the beginning of their life. The sex ratio at birth has been calculated after deducting the delayed registration of more than one year for the year 2020," the report said. None of the States or UTs have recorded sex ratio at birth below 880.

The report noted that 1,43,379 infant deaths were registered in 2020 and the share of rural areas was only 23.4%, while that of urban areas was 76.6% in total registered infant deaths. "Non-registration of infant deaths in rural areas was a cause of concern," it stated.

The Delimitation Commission headed by Justice Ranjana Prakash Desai finalised the delimitation process in Jammu and Kashmir and released the notification on the new status of 90 Assembly constituencies in the State.

Now, 43 constituencies will be part of Jammu region and 47 will be in Kashmir region.

Quota for ST community

The Commission, which held detailed discussions with political parties and other stakeholders during the exercise, said nine Assembly constituencies have been reserved for STs, out of which six are in Jammu region and three are in the Vallev.

ley. "It is worthwhile to mention that the Constitution of erstwhile Jammu and Kashmir State did not provide for reservation of seats for the Scheduled Tribes in the Legislative Assembly," the Commission said in a statement.

The State will continue to have five Parliamentary Constituencies. The panel considered Jammu and Kashmir region as one single Union Territory and one constituency has been carved out combining Anantnag region in the Valley and Rajouri, Poonch of Jammu region. "According to this reorganisation, each Parliamentary Constituency will have 18 Assembly constituencies each," the release said.

The Opposition parties, however, are not happy with the final declaration. CPI(M) leader and spokesman of People's Alliance for Gupkar Declaration, Yousuf Tarigami, said the delimitation exercise is bound to alter the electoral demography of the region in the long run.

"Though the Delimitation Commission was constituted under the Delimitation Act of 2002, it has redrawn the constituencies of Jammu and Kashmir in accordance with

the provisions of J&K Re-organisation Act 2019 which has been challenged in the Supreme Court. The said Re-organisation Act modified the law of enfranchisement of J&K. The exercise is bound to disempower the people of Jammu and Kashmir in the long run," Tarigami said.

Name changes

The Commission said names of

some constituencies have also been changed keeping in view the demand of local representatives. Name changes included naming Tangmarg as Gulmarg, Zoonimar as Zaidibal, Sonwar as Lal Chowk, Padder as Padder-Nagseni, Kathua North as Jasrota, Kathua North as Jasrota, Kathua South as Kathua, Khour as Chhamb, Mahore as Gulabhgarh and Darhal as Budhal.

The Commission recommended the Centre to provide at least two members (one of them must be a female) from the community of Kashmiri migrants in the Assembly and such members may be given power at par with that of nominated members, of the Legislative Assembly of Union Territory of Puducherry. It has also recommended that the Centre gives displaced individuals from Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir some representation in the Jammu and Kashmir Legislative Assembly, by way of nomination of representatives of the displaced persons from Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir.

SRESTHA closed and 32 directorates merged to form seven verticals; unions say move is demoralising employees

Going ahead with its downsizing plan, the Indian Railways has announced the closure of the Special Railway Establishment for Strategic Technology and Holistic Advancement (SRESTHA), Lucknow.

Established in March 2016, the SRESTHA directorate, part of the Research Designs and Standards Organisation (RDSO), was tasked with the role of taking up long-term railway research projects requiring technological advancement.

As part of the restructuring plan, the Railways also decided to merge 32 directorates of the RDSO and brought them under seven

verticals – administration, infrastructure, rolling stock, traction and power supply, signal and telecommunication, resource and testing and traffic and psychology.

The establishment of Principal Executive Director, Defence Research, at the Defence Research and Development Organisation, New Delhi, was detached from the RDSO.

The Railways also pro-

The Cow dung log machine is used to manufacture cow dung-based fuelwood in long log-like shape.



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
A mixture of cow dung and cattle waste like dried waste paddy is ed in the inlet hopper of this machine. The machine then breaks it down, mixes it and compresses the mixture in the shape of a log. This log is then sun-dried and can be later used a fuel wood in various situations.

This machine can process 3,000 kilograms of cow dung every day to produce 1,500 kg of cow dung-based logs that can be used as firewood for the cremation of five to seven bodies, saving roughly two trees in each cremation.

It can also help the Gaushala to clear roughly one lakh 50 thousand to one lakh 70 thousand kilograms of cow dung every month.

Using cow dung-based log machine can help Gaushala to cater to their waste management problems, provide an additional source of employment to its employees or nearby villagers and contribute in reducing deforestation. It also helps to engage the non-milking cows in a economical activity, generating funds to support all the cows in a Gaushala.

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This is likely the first kind of credit scheme for prisoners in India. Existing loans initiatives for inmates are for rehabilitation after completion of their prison terms.

The credit scheme, called Jivhala meaning 'affection' in Marathi, has been launched primarily for convicted inmates who are undergoing a prison sentence of more than three years.

Indira Gandhi International (IGI) Airport in Delhi emerged as the second busiest airport in the world in March 2022, toppling the Dubai International Airport, according to travel data provider OAG.

IGI saw a total of 36.11 lakh seats deployed by various airlines. The top 10 busiest airport rankings by the OAG are based on the total domestic and international seat capacity and the frequency of flights. The airport replaced Dubai International Airport which witnessed 35.54 lakh seats. Atlanta Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport (ATL) retained the top position with 44.22 lakh seats.

IGI also climbed 21 spots compared with March 2019. While the number of seats deployed in March 2019 for Delhi airport was not immediately available, government data from the Airports Authority of India show that total domestic and international passengers at the airport in March 2022 was 92% (50.7 lakh) of the numbers seen in the corresponding month in 2019.

"India last month opened its borders and allowed the entry of fully-vaccinated international travellers. It has largely helped the travel and tourism industry and given a much-needed boost to air travel," Videh Kumar Jaipuriar, CEO, DIAL, said.

"We stressed on ensuring a free, open, inclusive and rulesbased Indo-Pacific region," he said. The two leaders also recalled the India-EU Connectivity Partnership and agreed to support efforts towards its implementation, acearly cording to the joint statement. One of the pacts signed will facilitate establishment of a Centre of Excellence on Green Shipping.

On the climate issue, the leaders welcomed the international agreement at COP-26 on the need for accelerated climate action for "holding the increase in the global average temperature to well below 2 degrees above pre-industrial levels and pursuing efforts to limit the temperature in-crease to 1.5 degree above preindustrial levels' Frederiksen said in her re-

marks that she and Modi condemned the killings in Bucha and supported an independent probe into it. Both in Berlin and Copenhagen, Modi has maintained that dialogue was the only way to resolve the Ukraine issue even as German chancellor Olaf Scholz and Frederiksen used their meet with Modi to attack Russia.

"The two PMs expressed their serious concern about the ongoing humanitarian crisis in Ukraine. They une quivocally condemned civilian deaths in Ukraine. They reiterated the need for an immediate cessation of hostilities.," said a joint statement.

40 mn more pushed into acute hunger last year: UN

The number of people facing hunger rose to 193 million last year as conflict, climate change and economic crises ravaged people's livelihoods, the UN's Food and Agriculture Organization said Wednesday.

While experts have warned that Russia's war in Ukraine could cause famine, the FAO said in an annual report that nearly 40 million more people were pushed into "acute food insecurity" in 2021.


Among 53 countries facing the problem, the most affected include the Democratic Republic of Congo, Ethiopia, Yemen and Afghanistan where millions face hunger after the country plunged into financial crisis following the Taliban takeover in 2021.

The United Nations defines "acute food insecurity" as when a person's inability to consume adequate food puts their lives or livelihoods in immediate danger.

"This is hunger that threatens to slide into famine and cause widespread death," the FAO said.

The number has risen constantly since the first report was published by the FAO, the World Food Programme and the European Union in 2016.

The increase in 2021 has been "driven by a toxic triple combination of conflict, weather extremes and economic shocks", with people affected in 53 countries, the FAO said.

NEW DELHI There were likely 47 lakh deaths, directly or indirectly attributable to COVID-19, in India in 2020 and 2021, a report by the World Health Organization (WHO) said on Thursday. These are the highest, by far, for any country and make up nearly a third of the 15 million such deaths estimated by the agency globally.

India officially estimated only 4.8 lakh cumulative deaths linked to COVID-19 as of December 2021, which implies that the WHO estimate is nearly 10 times the government count. As of May, India's official COVID-19 death toll is 5.2 lakh.

Minutes after the WHO released its estimate, India reiterated its "objection to the methodology" used.

Germany to extend €10-b green aid to India

Modi, Scholz discuss expansion of trade, energy, cultural linkages; nine pacts signed

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and German Chancellor Olaf Scholz have decided to launch an Indo-German Partnership for Green and Sustainable Development under which Germany has decided to provide additional development assistance of €10 billion till 2030 to supportIndia's green growth plans.

"In Glasgow, India increased its climate ambition and showed the world that for us green and sustainable growth is an article of faith...1 thank Germany and Chancellor Scholz (for the development assistance). We have decided to form a green hydrogen task force that will help increase green hydrogen infrastructure in both countries," Modi said at the sixth round of Biennial Inter Governmental Consultations (IGC) in Berlin on Monday.

The IGC is a unique mechanism which brings together several ministers and officials from both sides, including the two leaders, to engage in bilateral discussions on co-operation and partnership across a range of areas. The focus areas for the IGC included global security policy issues and common efforts to tackle the climate crisis.

The two sides signed nine agreements during the IGC that include renewable energy partnership, migration and mobility partnership, joint initiative on the implementation of triangular development co-operation projects in third countries and joint initiative on forest landscape restoration.

On Ukraine crisis

The PM said that India was worried about the humanitarian impact of the Russia-Ukraine conflict. He added that right from the beginning of the conflict India had called for a stop to violence and stressed on the importance of dialogue to sort the crisis. "There will be no winners. All will suffer. That is why we fa-

"We have from our side given humanitarian aid to Ukraine," the PM said, adding that India was also aiding other nations by exporting good grain and extending economic aid. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, Foreign Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and Jitendra Singh, Minister of State, Prime Minister's Office, also attended the IGC.

Expanding bilateral ties

Modi and Scholz discussed issues related to expansion of India-Germany cooperation, including trade and cultural linkages, as well as overall strategic partnership and global developments, in a one-on-one meeting and delegation level talks, also held on Monday.

Modi is on a three-day tour of

Europe and will also visit Denmark and France.

Modi expressed hope that the India-EU FTA talks will progress fast on the lines of the FTA deals signed recently with the UAE and Australia, that were completed in record time. He said that India's skilled workers and professionals had benefited the economies of several countries and the Indo-German Comprehensive Mobility and Migration Partnership being worked out will enable smooth movement of work force.

India exported merchandise estimated at \$38.19 billion in April 2022, a 24.2% increase from a year earlier but 9.5% lower than the record \$42.2 billion shipped out in March, official estimates released on Tuesday show.

The trade deficit, however er, expanded to \$20.07 bil-lion from \$18.5 billion in March, as imports grew at a faster 26.6% pace to \$58.26 billion. Sequentially, goods imports declined 4.1% last month from March's level.

Gold imports fell by a sharp 73% year-on-year to just \$1.7 billion, even as coal imports more than doubled to over \$4.7 billion from \$2 billion a year earlier. Petroleum imports comprising crude and products surged 81.2% to exceed \$19.5 billion, and made up a third of the total imports in the month.

'India's goods trade deficit has crossed \$200 billion for a 12-month period for the first time in April 2022," said Richard Rossow, Wadhwani chair in U.S.-India Policy Studies at the Washington-based security think tank, CSIS. Petroleum imports alone had accounted for \$172 billion during this period, he pointed out.

IOC launches methanol-blended petrol on pilot basis in Assam

Indian Oil Corp (IOC) rolled out M15 petrol — 15 per cent blend of methanol with petrol — on a pilot basis in Assam's Tinsukia district. Union Minister of State for Petroleum and Natural Gas Rameswar Teli launched the M15 petrol in the presence of Niti Aayog member VK Saraswat and IOC chairman SM Vaidya on Saturday. Teli said that blending fuel with methanol will provide respite from the rising prices. "Pilot rollout of M15 is a stepping stone towards achieving fuel independence and reducing the import burden," he said.

Union Minister of State for Petroleum and Natural Gas Rameswar Teli launched M15 petrol.

The launch has been done from Tinsukia because of availability of methanol.

Methanol is being manufactured by Assam Petrochemical Ltd in the surroundings of Digboi refinery.

M15 petrol is a 15% blend of methanol with petrol. In other words, M15 is a 15% Methanol blended petrol.



RBI turns hawkish, ups repo rate by 40 bps 'to tackle inflation'

If inflation remains elevated, it can be detrimental to growth, financial stability: RBI Governor


In a stunning mid-cycle move, the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) on Wednesday un-animously voted to raise the policy repo rate by 40 basis points from 4 per cent to 4.40 per cent with immediate ef-fect, in a clear indication that inflation may be spiralling to higher levels than anticipated. The move, preceding the US Fed announcement on a rate hike, also puts the RBI back on the curve after criticism for be-ing behind. As synchronised shocks of

rising commodity prices and supply disruptions unleashed by the Russia-Ukraine war moved the trajectory of inflation upwards, the six-member rate-setting committee de-cided to raise the repo rate after keeping it rock steady for two years since May 22, 2020. "As several storms hit together, our actions today are

important steps to steady the ship," explained RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das. The MPC also decided unanimously to remain accom-modative while focussing on withdrawal of accommoda-tion to ensure that inflation

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



The nutrition labelling system for food packets recommended by the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) will not only fail to enable consumers to make healthy choices but also mislead them about their nutritional value, warn experts who have called for the need to "insulate" policy-making from the influence of the food industry.



Warning system

"Warning signs educate consumers about harmful ingredients present in a food product and help them make healthy choices. They also give a repetitive educational message so that even for domestic cooking or buying street food that warning bell goes off. This educational component of a properly constructed warning system is missing in the health star [rating] system, which are like a movie rating system and are of no use," K. Srinath Reddy, president, Public Health Foundation of India (PHFI), said at a press conference.

He said that the system being proposed by the food

regulator was "devious" as it misled consumers about a product's nutrition profile.

Under the health star rating system, an algorithm assigns a product a certain number of stars based on "positive" components (fibre, protein, and fruit, vegetable, nut and legume content) balanced against other components (energy, sugars, sodium, and saturat-ed fat). He was launching a position statement endorsed by 21 organisations, including the Centre for Science and Environment, Consumer Voice, Cuts International, Indian Academy of Paediatrics, and the PHFI.

In the statement, the 21 organisations have demanded that warning labels should be made mandatory when the draft regulation is made public for stakeholder consultations; that "decisions on public health issues should be made without any conflicts of interest even at a consultative level"; and that while interactions with the food industry may happen on different platforms, they should not be part of meetings on policy decisions. India's services exports set a new record of \$254.4 billion (about ₹19 lakh crore) in 2021-2022, the Commerce Ministry said on Wednesday.

The exports also hit an all-time monthly high of \$26.9 billion in March, the Ministry added.

Telecommunications, computer and information services, other business services and transport were the top contributors to the exports, it added.

"The new record achieved in 2021-22 beats the previous high of \$213.2 billion in 2019-20," it said.

Rs 1.68 lakh crore in Apr, GST collection soars to all-time high

ENS ECONOMIC BUREAU NEW DELHI, MAY 1

REGISTERING THE highest level of collections since its rollout in July 2017, gross Goods and Services Tax (GST) collections rose to Rs 1.68 lakh crore in April, for sales in March, according to data released by the Union Finance Ministry on Sunday.

This marks a 20 per cent increase from the April 2021 level on the back of improved compliance, enforcement action against tax evaders and pick-up in economic activity.

During April 2022, 1.06 crore of the monthly summary GSTR-3B (self-declared) returns were filed, of which 97 lakh pertained to March, as against 92 lakh filed during April 2021. Also, 1.05 crore statements of invoices issued in GSTR-1 (outward supplies returns) were filed, the Ministry said.

"This shows clear improvement in the compliance behaviour, which has been a result of various measures taken by the tax administration to nudge taxpayers to file returns timely, to make compliance easier and smoother and strict enforcement action taken against errant taxpayers identified based on data analytics and artificial intelligence," the Ministry said.

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman highlighted the role of states in the highestever GST collections. "Sincerely recognise and appreciate the efforts made by each and every state in improving #GST revenue collection. India's economic recovery is sure to be on a sustained path due to all our efforts," she posted on Twitter.

Gross GST collection in April, which includes revenue of Centre and states, is at an all-time high and Rs 25,000 crore more than the previous high of Rs 1.42 lakh crore collected in March. In April last year, GST collections stood at Rs 1.40 lakh crore.

Experts said the rise could also be attributed to year-end activity, higher inflation rate, input tax credit being allowed only on timely compliance by vendors and high value of imports. CONTINUED ON PAGE 2

New Delhi, May 4 The crisis-ridden National Spot Exchange Ltd (NSEL) on Wednesday said the Supreme Court, Which exercised its powers under Article 142 of the Constitution, has approved the constitution of a committee, headed by Bombay High Court retired judge Pradeep Nandrajog, for recovery from defaulters against whom NSEL had secured money decrees

in the ₹ 5,600-crore NSEL payment crisis of July 2013.

Execution of decrees

NSEL said the committee will oversee and execute the decrees against defaulters by the sale of assets that have been attached



by the State of Maharashtra under the Maharashtra Protection of Interest of Depositors (MPID) Act and Enforcement Directorate (ED) across India.

NSEL had single-handedly sedecrees/arbitration cured awards worth ₹3,534.46 crore against NSEL defaulters. Further, an amount of ₹760.31 crore worth of defaulters' liabilities has already been crystallised by the committee appointed by the Bombay HC.

Proceedings for a decree against N.K. Protein worth ₹964 crore is pending before the Bombay HC. The Forensic Auditor appointed by the Economic Offence Wing, Mumbai Police, and the Serious Fraud Investigation Office (SFIO) have confirmed the liability of N.K. Protein to ₹964 crore. Two of the defaulters have already paid their liabilities amounting to ₹195.75 crore.

The recovery from the NSEL defaulters, after giving credit for the monies paid by them, stands at ₹5,454.52 crore and their attachment of assets are sufficient to cover the claims made by the trading clients if all claims are considered genuine.

Verification of claims

NSEL stated that the claims will, however, be verified by the committee appointed by the SC. The SFIO has said they have received claims worth ₹2,239.61 crore, out of which ₹935.09 crore appears to be doubtful, thereby, confirming the genuine claims to be of ₹ 1,304.61 crore only.







Harshada Garud became the first Indian to win a gold medal in the World junior weightlifting championships at Heraklion, Greece, on Monday.

Harshada rode on her snatch performance (70kg) to lift a total of 153kg and beat her nearest rival Turkey's Bektas Cansu by three kg in the women's 45kg weight class.

Moldova's Hincu Teodora-Luminita (149kg) took the third spot.

The 18-year-old Pune girl, who had earlier won the Khelo India Youth Games crown and the Asian championships bronze medal with an identical total of 139kg in 2020, did 64kg, 67kg and 70kg in snatch to push Spain's Marta Garcia (68kg) to the second place.

Harshada also lifted successfully in all her three

clean and jerk attempts to record 83kg, two kg less than Bektas (who had registered 65kg in snatch), to claim the second place.

However, she still managed to clinch a historic gold.

Another Indian in fray, Anjali Patel (snatch 67kg, clean and jerk 81kg) tied with Indonesian Najla Khoirunnisa on an aggregate of 148kg and ended up at the fifth place.

Both of them were one kg away from the third-placed Hincu.

Before this, Mirabai Chanu (women's 48kg, bronze, 2013, Lima), Jhilli Dalabehera (women's 48kg, bronze, 2018, Tashkent) and Achinta Sheuli (men's 73kg, silver, 2021, Tashkent) achieved podium finishes in the event.

"I was not well till December. My improvement happened after I joined the National camp. All credit to the coaches, the Indian Weightlifting Federation, the other support staff and my family for their support," said Harshada.



India, under new captain Rohit Sharma, finished the 2021-22 season as the World's No. 1 ranked T2OI team after a string of impressive performances at home but was a good nine points behind Australia in the annual Test rankings released by ICC on Wednesday.

The Black Caps from New Zealand finished the last season as the World No. 1 ODI team with the cut-off date being May 4, 2022.

India remained on top in T2OIs, extending the lead over second-placed England from one to five points. South Africa and Australia have overtaken New Zealand, which is now in sixth place. Similarly, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka are now ahead of Afghanistan (10th).

In the updated ODI rankings, New Zealand remains on top but its lead over En-

"India have also gained a point to move to 119 while England have had the biggest decrease of nine points as their 4-1 series win over India in 2018 is now dropped from the rankings. England's 88 rating points is their lowest since 1995," the release added.

Tony Brooks, the British 'racing dentist' who was Formula One's last surviving grand prix winner from the 1950s and finished second in the 1959 world championship, has died aged 90. The BBC said the news was announced by Brooks' daughter Giulia. Charles Anthony Standish Brooks, known as Tony, won six grands prix during one of the sport's deadliest eras, making his championship debut with BRM in 1956 and retiring in 1961 at the age of 29. He also drove for Vanwall, Ferrari and Cooper. The Briton, a keen amateur racer, was a 23-year-old dentistry student at Manchester University preparing for his finals when he won the 1955 non-championship Syracuse Grand Prix in Sicily. "Brooks was a tremendous driver, the greatest - if he'll forgive me saying this - 'unknown' racing driver there's ever been," late compatriot Stirling Moss told writer Nigel Roebuck in the 1986 book Grand Prix Greats. Pfizer sets up global drug development centre at IIT Madras Research Park

OUR BUREAU Chennai, May 4

Pharmaceutical giant Pfizer on Wednesday unveiled a global drug development centre at the IIT Madras Research Park, its first in Asia. The research and technology centre, which will be part of a network of 12 global centres, will support Pfizer's manufacturing centres worldwide and develop products.

Pfizer has invested over ₹150 crore (\$20 million) in the 61,000 sq ft facility, which is spread across two floors equipped with 10 advanced laboratories and a capacity to employ 250 scientists and technicians.

"The centre will focus on developing small molecules, including solid doses and sterile injectables, active pharmaceutical ingredients, and finished dosage forms. The centre will cater to all Pfizer products, including current and future innovative products and a



host of off-patent products," S Sridhar, Country Manager, Pfizer India, said during a press conference post the inaugural event.

Sridhar said that the company has invested over \$4.5 billion across its three manufacturing facilities in India at Visakhapatnam (sterile injectable manufacturing), Goa (Oral solids and Steroids) and Ahmedabad (injectable cytotoxic drugs) in addition to 25-30 contract manufacturing sites across the country.

Speaking at the launch, Tamil Nadu Health Secretary, J Radhakrishnan, said, "It is encouraging to see a company like Pfizer make a significant investment in R&D in India and added that the centre will offer Indian scientists the opportunity to establish a global footprint in medical R&D."



The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) plans to launch India's first Venus Mission 'Shukrayaan-I' in December 2024 window. The Shukrayaan mission is a planned orbiter to Venus to study the planet's surface and atmosphere.

Shukrayaan will be India's first orbiter mission to Venus after sending similar missions to the Moon and Mars. The mission aims to study the surface of the hottest planet in our solar system and unravel the mysteries under the Sulphuric Acid clouds enveloping it.

Several missions have flown to Venus since the 1960s but only a few in recent years. The European Space Agency's Venus Express orbited the planet between 2006 and 2014 and Japan sent Akatsuki spacecraft that entered the planet's orbit in 2015 after a previous unsuccessful attempt. Akatsuki is one of the few missions that are operational around Venus.

Isro to join race to Venus, eyes 2024 orbiter launch

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New Delhi: After successfully completing Moon and Mars missions, India is set to join the race with the US and several other countries to go to Venus. The mission's objective will be to study the Venusian atmosphere, which is toxic and corrosive in nature as clouds of sulfuric acid cover the planet.

Isro chairman S Somanath says the work on the mission has been going on for years and that the space agency is now "ready to send an orbiter to Venus". "The project report is made, overall plans are ready, money identified, all that thing is done. Building and putting a mission on Venus is possible

for India in a very short space of time, as the capability today exists with India," the Isro chairman said.

Isro is eyeing the December 2024 window for its launch with orbital manoeuvres planned for the following year when the Earth and Venus would be so aligned that the spacecraft could be put in the planet's orbit using minimum propellant. The next similar window will then be available in 2031. However, Isro is yet to officially release a timeline for the Venus mission.

Experiments planned for the Venus mission include an investigation of the surface processes and shallow subsurface stratigraphy, including active volcanic hotspots and lava flows, studying the structure, composition and dynamics of the atmosphere, and investigation of solar wind interaction with the Venusian Ionosphere. Nasa is also sending two spacecraft to Venus. European Likewise, the Space Agency has also announced a mission Venus.
