# PM announces visas for AYUSH therapy <sup>+</sup>

Modi says traditional medicine practices could attract people from across world

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday announced that a special visa category would be created soon for those who want to travel to the country to avail themselves of AYUSH therapies.

"Heal in India", he said, could become a big brand of this decade and wellness centres based on Ayurveda, Unani, Siddha and such traditional practices could be very popular and attract people from across the world. Traditional medicine helped Kerala promote tourism, and similarly, every State should

promote it, as this power was there in the entire country in every corner.

Mr. Modi was inaugurating a Global AYUSH Investment and Innovation Summit in Gandhinagar in the

presence of Director-General of WHO Tedros Ghebreyesus and Prime Minister of Mauritius Pravind Kumar Jugnauth. He held a bilateral meeting with Mr. Jugnauth on the sidelines of the sum-

mit. Mr. Modi said 'AYUSH mark', which gives authenticity to quality AYUSH products made in the country, would help promote traditional medicine industry.

Talking about the rising popularity of traditional medicines and wellness products, Mr. Modi said the possibilities of investment and innovation in the field of AYUSH (Ayurveda, Yoga, Unani, Siddha and Homeopathy) were unlimited. The sector was less than \$3 billion in 2014, which had now crossed \$18 billion.

# IISc, ISRO find way to make bricks from Martian soil

In Ridley Scott's 2015 sci-fi film, *The Martian*, botanist Mark Watney, who is trapped on the red planet, creates a garden using local soil and the crew's bio-waste, as well as water from rocket fuel. While vegetable gardens on Mars are still a distant dream, building houses may not be a problem – should humans colonise the planet.

Researchers from the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) and the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) have developed a way to make bricks from Martian soil with

the help of bacteria and urea. These 'space bricks' can be used to construct building-like structures on Mars that could facilitate human settlement on the red planet, said IISc in a press release.

Their research was published in the peer-reviewed open access scientific journal, *PLOSOne*.

The team first made the slurry by mixing Martian soil with guar gum, a bacterium called *Sporosarcina pasteurii*, urea and nickel chloride (NiCl<sub>2</sub>). "This slurry can be poured into moulds of any desired shape, and over a few days the bacteria convert the urea into crystals of calcium carbonate. These crystals, along with biopolymers secreted by the microbes, act as cement holding the soil particles together," stated the release.

This method ensures that the bricks are less porous, which was a problem with other methods used to make

Martian bricks.

"The bacteria seep deep into the pore spaces, using their own proteins to bind the particles together, decreasing porosity and leading to stronger bricks," said Alope Kumar, associate professor, Department of Mechanical Engineering at IISc, and one of the senior authors of the paper.

The slurry-casting method was developed with the help of Koushik Viswanathan, assistant professor in the Department of Mechanical Engineering, IISc.

In the past, the team had made bricks out of lunar soil using a similar method. However, the previous method could only produce cylindrical bricks, while the current slurry-casting method can also produce bricks of complex shapes, the release stated.

Another challenge was the composition of Martian soil, which has a lot of iron that causes toxicity to organisms. "In the beginning, our bacteria did not grow at all. Adding nickel chloride was the key step in making the soil hospitable to the bacteria," said Kumar.

The team is now gearing up to investigate how the atmosphere in Mars combined with low gravity affects the 'space bricks'. Martian atmosphere is a hundred times thinner than that of Earth's, and contains over 95% carbon dioxide, which may significantly affect bacterial growth, stated the release. To recreate conditions on the red planet, researchers have constructed a device-MARS (Martian Atmosphere Simulator).

# Judges must give reasons for bail decisions, says SC

Cryptic orders have no place in the judicial system, it says

Judges are duty-bound to give reasons for granting or denying bail, especially in cases involving serious offences and hardened criminals, the Supreme Court has held.

Cryptic bail orders without giving any reasons have no place in the judicial system, it said on Tuesday.

"There is a recent trend of passing such orders granting or refusing to grant bail, where the courts make a general observation that 'the facts and the circumstances' have been considered. No specific reasons are indicated which precipitated the passing of the order by the court," a Bench led by Chief Justice of India N.V. Ramana observed in a judgment.

The case concerned the grant of bail by the Rajasthan High Court to a man ac-



cused of raping his minor niece for years. The man is an "infamous criminal" with 20 pending criminal cases to his name, involving offences like murder, attempt to murder, kidnapping, dacoity, etc.

### Fundamental tenets

Setting aside the bail order, Chief Justice Ramana, who wrote the verdict, observed that "judges are duty-bound to explain the basis on which

they have arrived at a conclusion... Reasoning is the life blood of the judicial system. That every order must be reasoned is one of the fundamental tenets of our system. An unreasoned order suffers the vice of arbitrariness".

### Bail revoked

"There is need to indicate reasons for *prima facie* concluding why bail was being granted particularly where the accused is charged of having committed a serious offence. Any order devoid of such reasons would suffer from non-application of mind..." the judgment noted.

The judgment said the High Court erred in granting bail to the accused in a mechanical manner without any reasoning. The top court ordered the accused to surrender in a week.

### Static News

Nuthalapati Venkata Ramana (born 27 August 1957) is an Indian judge who is serving as the 48th and current chief justice of India.

There are a total of 48 chief justices of India that have served since the establishment of the Supreme Court of India in 1950, which superseded the Federal Court of India. The Federal Court of India came into being on 1 October 1937. The seat of the court was the Chamber of Princes in the Parliament building in Delhi. It began with a chief justice and two puisne judges. The first chief justice was Sir Maurice Gwyer and the other two judges were Sir S. M. Sulaiman and M. R. Jayakar. It functioned until the establishment of the Supreme Court of India on 28 January 1950.

# India's Q1 imports lift trade with China to a record high

Jan.-March bilateral trade climbs 15% to \$31.96 billion; India's exports slump 26%

A sharp increase in India's imports of Chinese goods in the first quarter of 2022 lifted bilateral trade by 15% to a record \$31.96 billion, trade data released by China on Wednesday show.

Imports surged 28% from the year-earlier period to \$27.69 billion. India's exports, however, **slumped** 26% to \$4.87 billion.

In 2021, India's trade with China surpassed the \$100 billion mark for the first time to reach \$125 billion, driven by demand for electronic products, chemicals and auto components. India's imports accounted for a bulk of

the trade, reaching \$97.5 billion, while exports crossed \$20 billion for the first time.

Compared with the pre-pandemic levels in 2019, first-quarter imports jumped 54%, while exports rose 9%.

The 15% increase in India-China trade was among the highest for China's major trading partners.

Overall, China's exports climbed 13.4%, the **General Administration of Customs**

(GAC) said, while imports rose 7.5%. Trade rose 9.9% with the U.S. and that with the EU grew by 10.2%.

Economists are concerned about the possible impact that the current COVID-19 outbreaks and lockdowns, particularly in Shanghai, may have on global supply chains as well as on China's trade performance in the current April-June quarter.

China faces "multiple challenges and risks" as well as "sudden internal and external factors" that would pose a challenge for the country's trade performance in 2022, said Li Kuiwen, spokesperson for the GAC.

# Automobile sales slid 6% in 2021-22, says SIAM

'Chip availability immediate challenge'

Impacted by supply-side challenges, total automobile **dispatches** during the last financial year fell 6%, dragged down by lower sales of two-wheelers and entry-level cars amid rising vehicle and fuel costs, according to the Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM).

As per the data released by the industry body, two-wheeler sales fell by 11% to 1,34,66,412 units.

### **PV sales rise**

Passenger vehicle sales during 2021-22 stood at 30,69,499 units, up 13%

 Sales of all four segments of the auto industry are below even the 2018-19 level

from 27,11,457 units a year earlier, mainly driven by a 40% growth in sales of utility vehicles. In March 2022, however, the wholesales declined 4% to 2,79,501 units.

"Despite some recovery from a low base, sales of all four segments of the auto industry are below even the 2018-19 level," Kenichi Ayukawa, President, SIAM said.

He added that the immediate challenge for the industry in most segments is semiconductor availability.

Top seed Australia notched a 2-1 victory against India to top group-A in the Asia-Oceania Junior Davis Cup under-16 boys' tennis tournament at the DLTA Complex on Wednesday.

Bushan Haobam and Rushil Khosla failed to win a set in singles against Charlie Camus and Hayden Jones, but combined well to inspire confidence with a 7-5, 3-6, [10-3] victory in the doubles.
