CM Nitish Kumar said the state government will bear the cost of the caste census exercise.

Caste-based census would be a time-bound exercise. Bihar legislature has earlier passed resolutions twice for caste-based census.

The first decadal census was carried out in 1881; it included data on caste. 1931 Socio Economic and Caste Census was the last caste census data that was made public

The Bihar Cabinet on Thursday gave its nod for a headcount of all castes in the State, allocating a budgetary outlay of ₹500 crore for the mammoth exercise and setting deadline of February 23 next for completion of the survey.

Talking to reporters after the Cabinet meeting chaired by Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, Chief Secretary Amir Subhani said work will begin as soon as the requisite notification was issued by the general administration department.

"The general administration department shall be the nodal authority for the survey of castes. The notification shall be issued at the earliest," Mr. Subhani said at a press conference.

The State government has embarked on the exercise in the wake of the Centre expressing its inability to undertake headcount of castes other than the SCs and STs as part of the Dalits.

Caste-based census to be held in Bihar

A multi-party meeting held in Bihar on Wednesday unanimously decided to start the caste-based census very soon.

All parties which have representation in the legislature attended the meeting, chaired by Chief Minister Nitish Kumar. Three parties - the Vikassheel Insaan Party (VIP) led by Mukesh Sahani, the Lok Janshakti Party (Ram Vilas) led by Chirag Paswan and his estranged uncle Pashupati Kumar Paras-led Rashtriya Lok Janshakti Party - were not invited for the meeting as they have no representation in the legislature.

"It was unanimously decided to conduct castebased census and it will be done very soon after the proposal was placed in the Cabinet. Proper training of those involved in such a mega exercise too will be given," Mr. Kumar told presspersons. The Chief Minister said it would be a "time-bound exercise and each and every detail of caste, sub-castes, community and religion will be taken care of for the development of all people". He said the "census report will be published so that no one is left out and media too will be briefed about it from time to time".

Since its inauguration, the portal has been visited by more than 4.5 lakh users with 1.2 million page views. The portal currently has an impressive repository of 1151 articles on AI, 701 news stories, 98 reports, 95 case studies and 213 videos. It also has one of the best databases on India's AI ecosystem featuring details of 121 government initiatives and 281 startups.

Ban on single-use plastic from July

Shaheed Bhagat Singh Punjab State Environment Award to be institutionalised

To reduce carbon emissions, the Punjab Government on Sunday announced a ban on single-use plastic from next month. Rahul Tewari, Secretary, Science, Technology and Environment, announced the decision during a virtual statelevel function to mark the World Environment Day.

Single-use plastics are most commonly used for packaging and serviceware such as bottles, wrappers, straws, and bags.

"The ban on single-use plastic will be imposed from July to make Punjab greener and healthier. The state government led by Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann is committed to making the state clean. green and pollution-free by walking on the path shown by our revered Gurus," he said.

The Secretary also announced 55 sewage treatment plants (STPs) across the state. "The ultra-modern plants will reduce water pollution to a certain extent, and use treated water for cultivation and other



allied activities." he said.

Tewari also talked about the government's initiatives to convert fossil-fuel-based industrial units into naturalgas-based units. "The government has started online monitoring of industrial units by installing state-of-the-art meters, while online monitoring stations to check water and air pollution levels have been installed," he said.

The government had set a

target of planting 1.20 crore saplings this year, Tewari said, adding the state was ready with the Climate Action Plan 2.0 to reduce carbon emissions.

NHAI sets 1,750-km target for 2022-23, may mop up ₹20,000 crore

THE NATIONAL HIGHWAYS Authority of India (NHAI) has decided to monetise highway stretches with combined length of 1,750 km in 2022-23, a move which help it raise around ₹20,000 crore.

It has prepared an "indicative" list of road assets to be monetised in the current fiscal which includes 14 stretches with length between 6.49 km and 280 km in different parts of the country.

Asset monetisation is central to NHAI's plan to mitigate its debt burden, which stood at a worrisome ₹3.5 trillion at the end of last financial year.

Monestisation of operational assets will be through the toll-operate-transfer (TOT), infrastructure investment trusts (InvIT) and toll securitisation modes.

Recently, the NHAI cancelled the bidding processes for two TOTbundles — sixth and eighth — as the highest bids did not match up to its expectations

match up to its expectations.

The NHAI will not borrow from the market in 2022-23. The budgetary outlay for the agency this year is estimated at ₹1.34 trillion, much higher than



the level in recent years.

Crisil's Jagannarayan Padmanabhan said the authority to sail through the revised target for the current fiscal comfortably given the current level of investors' appetite.

Replying to a question in Lok Sabha on December 2, 2021, minister for road transport and highways Nitin Gadkari had said the authority has identified a total of 21,700 km highway length formonetisation in three years starting from FY23.

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However, in the Budget for FY23, the monetisation target was set at ₹20,000 crore, indicating that just around 1,800 km stretches would be on offer.

The rise in NHAI's debt level is mainly because of the steady rise in highway construction. From 1,901 km in 2013-14, construction increased to 4,325 km in 2021-22. Debt servicing is already is a huge burden for NHAI.

As reported by FE earlier, a little less than Re one out of every Rs five expenditure by the NHAI in 2022-23 will go towards debt servicing.

According to the estimates of the ministry of road transport and highways (MoRTH) presented to a parliamentary standing committee, NHAI has to spend₹31,049 crore on servicing debtin 2022-23. The amount will go up to ₹31,735 crore in 2023-24. In 2021-22, NHAI spent ₹40,337 crore on debt servicing.

1st e-bus for MSRTC in its diamond jubilee year

The Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation (MSRTC), shaken by monthslong, state-wide strike by its remployees, will celebrate its 74th anniversary on Wednesday and enter into the diamond jubilee year: On June 1, 1948, the first bus service of MSRTC was launched on the Pune-Almednagar route. To celebrate the historical day, the corporation will launch its first-ever electric bus on Wednesday on the same route (Pune-Almednagar).

Laxman Kevate, the conductor of the first bus, will lag-off the maiden e-bus service of the corporation. Deputy chief minister Ajit Pawar and other dignitaries are likely to be present at the corporation's regional office in Pune on this occasion. Chief Minister Uddhaw Thackeray is likely to join the function through video link.

function through video link. Initially, the transport body will operate six daily services with a 12-metre long e-bus with a seating capacity of 43, on the Pune-Ahmednagar route. In one charge, these e-buses can go up to 200-250 km as per the load factor and the number of passengers travelling.

"In the next couple of

"In the next couple of months, the e-bus service will be introduced on other prominent intercity routes of the state such as Pune-Mumbai, Pune-Kolhapur and Pune-Aurangabad in a phased manner," said officials. The

MSRTC will get 1,000 e-buses and 2,000 CNG buses in a phased mamer in the near future. As part of this, the coproration is expected to get the first slot of 150 e-buses by the end of July 2022. These zero emission and zero noise buses are equipped with GPS devices, ramps for the differently-abled, panic buttons, CCTV cameras and other security related facilities.

Since 1948, the MSRTC has grown across the state and currently has nearly 1 lakh employees working at 248 depots across Maharashtra. Since October last year it was shaken by the state wide protest by its employees largely over the demand to be merged with the state government, to which the authorities didn't relent.

Cabinet allows co-operatives to procure through GeM platform

New Delhi, June 1

The Union Cabinet has given its approval for expanding the mandate of the government's online public procurement platform, Government e-Market (GeM), by allowing procurement by co-operatives.

"More than 8.54 lakh registered co-operatives and their 27 crore members would benefit from this initiative," according to an official release issued by the government after the meeting on Wednesday.

Allowing co-operative societies to register on GeM as buyers would help them in getting competitive prices through an open and, transparent process, it added.

The GeM was launched on August 9, 2016 by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India to create an open and transparent procurement platform for government buyers.

The Ministry of Cooperation, in consultation with the GeM SPV, will prepare the validated list of cooperatives to be onboarded on GeM for pilot as well as subsequent scale up.

"This will ensure that technical capacity and logistics requirement of the GeM system are taken into account while deciding the pace of on boarding of cooperative as buyers on GeM," the release said.

ICMR issues guidance documents streamlining **UAV** services for health

F ollowing success of its pilot projects envisaging usage of drones to deliver medicines in the country's inaccessible and remote terrains during Covid-19 crisis, the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has now issued guidance documents to streamline services of the unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) for healthcare.

Medical supplies load up to 6 kg including BCG, measles and Covid-19 vaccines, which can be stored between 2°C and 8°C, along with tablets, capsules, syrups in bottles, gloves and syringes can be transport-ed safely by drones, as per the document.

The ICMR took to Twitter to announce the release of their 'Guidance Document for use of Drones in Healthcare'. The guidebook was released during the Bharat Drone Mahotsav 2022 that was held

on May 27 and May 28. The ICMR said they had conducted field research in Healthcare delivery by drones from Manipur to Nagaland. This field experience formed the basis of the guidance doc-

Following the success of the same exercise, wherein the medical supplies delivered under i-Drone project includ-ed Covid-19 vaccines, vaccines used routine immunisation programs, antenatal care medicines, multi-vitamins, syringes and gloves, the guid-ance book has been released, said an official from the ICMR.

The document emulates the regulatory approvals required from competent authorities and the air space related issues are highlighted. The book also talks about selecting drones and choosing their take-off and landing sites. Step-by-step preparation of carrier boxes and loading and unloading procedures are also described.

The study which was conducted in Manipur, Nagaland and the Andaman and Nicobar Islands provided promising results, on the basis of which the Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA), the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) and other regulatory authorities granted permission to fly drones beyond the Visual Line Of Sight, said the official.

oal imports, which had reached a peak of 248 Million Tonnes (MT) in 2019-20, declined continuously during the next two years to 215 MT in 2020-21 and further to 209 MT in 2021-22.

Despite a steep rise in actual demand for coal from 956 MT in 2019-20 to 1027 MT in 2021-22, coal imports have not increased.

Coal imports grew at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 22.86% during the period 2009-10 to 2013-14. At this CAGR, coal imports would have reached 705 MT in 2020-21 and further to 866 MT in 2021-22. The import of coal could be checked only by



sustaining increased domestic supply over the years.

All India coal production has increased from 716 MT in 2020-21 to 777 MT in 2021-22 resulting in an increase of 61 MT. Therefore, despite a steep rise in actual demand for coal from 906 MT in 202021 to 1027 MT in 2021-22, coal imports could be contained due to increased domestic dispatch from 691 MT in

2020-21 to 818 MT in 2021-22.
Domestic dispatch has not only increased to the power sector but also to the non-power sector by 101 MT in

2020-21 to 104 MT in 2021-22.

The decline in coal imports during 2021-22 is largely due to a decrease in imports by the power sector which came down from 45 MT in 2020-21 to 27 MT in 2021-22, a decline of almost 40%. The decline is steeper when compared with coal imports by the powers sector in 2021-22 to the pre-Covid year of 2019-20 when such import was 69 MT. This is despite the fact that toal thermal power generation in the country increased to 1115 BU in 2021-22 from 1032 BU in 2020-21, an increase of 83 BU in absolute terms and almost 8 % in percentage terms.

Coking Coal import was 57

Coking Coal import was 57 MT with a growth of 11.65% during 2021-22 which is largely used in the Steel Sector. However, as compared to the preCovid year of 2019-20, the growth in coking coal import is around 10 %. Coal imported by Non-regulated sectors (Cement, Sponge Iron & Paper etc) increased to 125 MT in 2021-22 from 119 MT in 2020-21 an increase of 5.23 %. Compared to the pre-Covid year of 2019-22, when imports by the non-regulated sector were 127 MT, imports by this sector have actually declined in 2021-22. Thus, the increase in import of coal by the nonower sector during 2021-22 is largely on account of growth in import of coking coal and import of coal by the non-reg ulated sector which largely imports high-grade thermal

The supply of both these categories of coal is limited in the country.

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

Setting the stage for appointment of the next Chief of Defence Staff (CDS), the government has amended Service Rules of the Army, Navy and Air Force, allowing retired Service Chiefs and three-star officers eligible for consideration for the country's top military post.

However, with an age li-

mit that the retired officer should not have attained 62 years on the date of appointment, retired Service chiefs are largely ruled out, especially so for the present consideration.

"The Central Government may, if considered necessary, in public interest, appoint as CDS, an officer who is serving as Lieutenant General or General or an officer who has retired in the rank of Lieutenant General or General but has not attained the age of 62 on the date of appointment," the amendment in the Service Rules of the Army says in the gazette dated June 6, 2022. Similar amendment was made in the service rules of Navy and Air Force as well.

Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Thursday said Delhi is paving the way for new-age governance through initiatives like Faceless Services and Automated Driving Test Track.

Kejriwal, who inspected the Sarai Kale Khan RTO, said, "Delhi's first and only state in India to offer Faceless Services; kicked off the initiative through the Transport Department last year." Kejriwal said less than 100 people visit the RTO each day whereas 2,000 used to come earlier. He said about 16 lakh Delhiites have benefitted from Faceless Services in the last 9-10 months.

"RTO offices had become havens for corruption; there used to be a saying that the collection starts at the bottom and RTO offices had become havens for corruption; there used to be a saying that the collection starts at the bottom and goes to the top

goes to the top," the Delhi Chief Minister said.

"We run a highly honest government, which is why we are making it easier for the public to access the system," he said.

Kejriwal said other states have picked up the initiative learning from Delhi; all states must learn from each other's good works, that's only how the country can progress.

"Sarai Kale Khan is Delhi's first automated driving test track, which was built in 2018. Since then 12 other automated tracks have been built all over Delhi," Kejriwal said.

Evening shifts have been started to help working professionals; they can come take the test from 5:00 PM to 7:00 PM, be said

Kejriwal tweeted, "Delhi is the first and only state to start faceless services in the country. We started them in the Transport Department last year. I inspected the Sarai Kale Khan office today. To avert frauds, govt launches e-stamping facility in Punjab

In a decision to bring more efficiency and check the pilferage of state revenue, the Punjab government has abolished physical stamp papers. The stamp paper of any denomination can now be obtained via e-stamp (computerized print-out) from any stamp vendor or from banks authorised by the state government.

After launching the facility, Punjab revenue minister Bram Shanker Jimpa said earlier the estamping facility was applicable only to values of above Rs.20,000. "We are extending this facility to stamp papers for all

denominations starting from Rs One," he said.

The minister said this decision taken by the Punjab government led by chief minister Bhagwant Mann will at least save Rs 35 Crore annually, which is incurred on printing of stamp papers, besides facilitating the common public to obtain stamp papers in a hassle-free manner.

He said that most of the time the general public had to face difficulty in getting the stamp paper when it was not available with the stamp vendor or had to purchase at higher prices. Jimpa said on 27 May a notification has been issued for the implementation of the e-stamp system.

Court directs govt. to maintain eco-sensitive zone to protect natural resources

The Supreme Court on Friday directed that every protected forest, national park and wildlife sanctuary across the country should have a mandatory eco-sensitive zone (ESZ) of a minimum one km starting from their demarcated boundaries.

Environment Ministry guidelines show that the purpose of declaring ESZs around national parks, forests and sanctuaries is to create some kind of a "shock absorber" for the protected

These zones would act as a transition zone from areas of high protection to those involving lesser protection.



Mining is not permitted within national parks and wildlife sanctuaries.

A three-judge Bench of Justices L. Nageswara Rao, B.R. Gavai and Aniruddha Bose, in a 60-page judgment, highlighted how the nation's natural resources have been for years ravaged by mining and other activities. The judgment, by Justice Bose, observed that the

government should not confine its role to that of a "facilitator" of economic activities for the "immediate upliftment of the fortunes of the State".

The State also has to act as a trustee for the benefit of the general public in relation to the natural resources so that sustainable development could be achieved in the long term.

"Such a role of the State is more relevant today, than, possibly, at any point of time in history with the threat of climate catastrophe resulting from global warming looming large," Justice Bose wrote for the Bench.

The judgment came on a petition instituted for the protection of forest lands in

the Nilgiris district of Tamil Nadu. Subsequently, the scope of that writ petition was enlarged by the court so as to protect such natural resources throughout the country.

In a series of directions, the court held that in case any national park or protected forest already has a buffer zone extending beyond one km, that would prevail. In case the question of the extent of buffer zone was pending a statutory decision, then the court's direction to maintain the one-km safety zone would be applicable until a final decision is arrived. The court directed that "mining within the national parks and wildlife sanctuaries shall not be permitted".

LAUNCHING THE Single Nodal Agency (SNA) dashboard, a system which tracks transfer of funds to states for Centrally sponsored schemes and utilisation of funds by central agencies, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Tuesday said it will make governance more transparent and realise better value for every rupee sent by the Centre by 'just-intime' money release.

The SNA dashboard of Public Financial Management System (PFMS), launched by the Minister as part of the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav iconic week celebrations, was put in place in July 2021 and all states got on board by March this year. The SNA provides information about what the state has spent, and Centre releases

send the money only when it sees it getting utised. Ministry officials spoke about another system for cash management, the Treasury Single Account (TSA) system, for autonomous bodies like Indian Council of Agricultural Research.

Finance Secretary T V Somanathan said this system would help cut down on the interest expenditure as money would be released at the stage where it is needed. "... So the SNA and TSA help us to minimise the interest costs borne by Gol and that is not a trivial cost. That actually helps us a lot, particularly in a difficult year like the current financial year. These are extremely helpful in containing fiscal deficit within what is possible," he said.

Puri launches 'Leaders in Climate Change Management' programme

Union Housing and Urban Affairs Minister Hardeep Singh Puri on Monday launched the 'Leaders in Climate Change Management' (LCCM) programme aimed at building capacity among urban professionals to lead climate action across sectors and geographies in the country.

In a statement, the Ministry said to facilitate the face-to-face learning programme, the Administrative Training Institute (ATI), Mysuru has also signed a tripartite Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA) and the WRI India, becoming the first delivery partner of the LCCM programme.

LCCM envisions capaci-

tating 5,000 professionals, including mid to junior-level government officials and front-line workers, and preparing them to champion climate change adaptation and mitigation solutions towards a coordinated effort to achieve India's climate commitments, according to the statement.

At the event, Puri said the Narendra Modi government has taken many concrete steps in pushing the sustainability agenda forward. At COP26 in Glasgow, Prime Minister Modi announced India's aggressive agenda on climate change through the Panch Amrit action plan, which envisages India becoming a net-zero emission country by 2070, the minister pointed out.

"The LCCM programme seeks to not only identify hundreds of climate leaders but also focus on how these leaders can



be oriented in terms of their training and how they will move forward. The very fact that we are thinking about this is a revolutionary step," Puri said.

Presenting the LCCM programme, its structure and aim to upskill urban climate leadership in the country, WRI India CEO OP Agarwal said the key challenge in building capacity for mid-career professionals is using the right kind of pedagogy — a teaching style that encourages learning by doing, rather than by just listening to lectures.

Agarwal also said LCCM has fully recognised this and adopted this kind of teaching style. The online learning will be hosted on the National Urban Learning Platform (NULP), the capacity building arm of the NIUA. It will also be hosted and supported by ATI, Mysuru. The programme aims to sign similar MoUs with ATIs across the country over the next few months, the ministry said.


■ Why JanSamarth portal?

JanSamarth is a digital portal linking 13 credit-linked schemes un by the government to a single platform. A beneficiary can digitally check eligibility in few simple steps, apply online under the scheme she is eligible for and receive approvals digitally. No need to visit separate websites for each scheme.

The portal will check eligibility, give in-principle sanction and send the application to the selected bank. It will also keep the beneficiaries updated at each stage of the journey and hep avoid multiple visit to bank branches.

How to apply for loans through the portal?

Currently, there are four loan categories and under each loan category there are various schemes listed. For a preferred category, one needs to check eligibility by answering a few questions. Once eligible is confirmed, the applicant may select to proceed to "apply online" to receive digital approval.

■ What are the documents required?

Each scheme has different documentation requirements. To apply online in the portal, the basic documents required would be Aadhaar number, voter ID, PAN, bank statement.etc.

Minister for Civil Aviation unveils national air sports policy

For the first time in India, air sports such as paragliding or hot-air ballooning will come under a four-tier governance structure with the Air Sports Federation of India (ASFI) as the apex body which will oversee aspects such as regulation, certification, accidents and penalties.

Jyotiraditya Scindia, Minister for Civil Aviation, on Tuesday unveiled the national air sports policy. "Air sports is one area which has the ability to transform into a huge industry," he said.

He said that the air sports industry in the country was today worth ₹80-100 crore, with nearly 5,000 providers, which could grow 10 times in terms of revenue and yield 1 lakh direct jobs apart from a multiplier impact on the economy.

Four-tier structure

The policy lays down a fourtier governance structure with the ASFI at the top, followed by national associations for individual sports and their regional and district-level units.

The ASFI will be an autonomous body under the Mi-

nistry of Civil Aviation (Mo-CA) which will represent India at global platforms related to air sports such as the World Air Sports Federation and will also conduct competitions across the country through different national air sports associations.

The ASFI will provide governance over different aspects such as regulation, certification, competitions, awards and penalties, and will publish its draft guidelines within a period of six months. It will be chaired by the Secretary, MoCA, who will nominate up to three eminent experts related to air sports as members of the ASFI governing council.

Sports that will come

within its ambit are aeromodelling, model rocketry, amateur-built and experimental aircraft, ballooning, drones, gliding, powered gliding, parachuting, paramotoring, powered aircraft and rotorcraft.

"Initially, these bodies will receive financial support from MoCA. It is a virtuous cycle, because once we have our teams participating in international more funds will flow in," said Amber Dubey, Joint Secretary (MoCA).

The government will also look at various incentives to encourage the sport such as reducing GST on air sports equipment from 18%-28% to 5% or less, Mr. Scindia said.

: 10% ethanol blending target achieved, says PM

PRIME MINISTER NARENDRA
Modi announced on Sunday
that India has achieved the
target of 10% ethanol blending in petrol five months
before deadline.

Speaking at a programme on the 'Save Soil Movement,' which coincided with World Environment Day, Modi also cited a number of measures taken by his government to protect the environment, saying its efforts have been multidimensional despite the country having a negligible role in climate change.

The rise in ethanol blend-

The rise in ethanol blending in petrol from 1.5% in 2014 to 10% now has reduced carbon emission by 27 lakh tonne and saved ₹41,000 crore of forex reserve. This has also brought ₹40,000 crore of income to farmers, he said, adding the feat was achieved on Sunday.

on Sunday.

The prime minister said India has also reached its goal of having 40% of its installed power generation from nonfossil fuel-based sources nine years before the deadline.

years before the deadline.

Modi said India's forest cover had grown by over 20,000 sq km in the last eight years, with wildlife numbers also seeing a record growth. Solar energy capacity has increased 18 times and initiatives like the Hydrogen Mission, circular economy and scrappage policy are examples of the commitment to environment protection, he said.

He expressed satisfaction that his government's key programmes of the last eight years have an angle of environment protection, citing the Swachh Bharat Mission, waste-to-wealth-related programme, reduction of single use plastic, one Sun one earth or ethanol blending programme, as examples of multi-dimensional efforts for preservation of environment.

Taking a jibe at the developed world, he said it had not only exploited more and more resources of the earth, but also contributed most to carbon emissions. While the average

To save soil, India has focused on five main things, he said, citing efforts to make the soil chemical-free, save organisms that live in the soil, maintain soil moisture, increase the availability of water and remove the damage happening to soil due to less groundwater, and to stop the continuous erosion of soil due to the reduction of forests.

Farmers earlier lacked information about the types of ind deficiency in soil and the quantity of water, he said, noting that his government launched a campaign to provide them soil health cards.

A campaign to conserve 13 big rivers has also started, and along with reducing pollution in water, work is also being done to plant forests on the banks of rivers, he said, noting that this will add forest cover of 7,400 sq km.

Modi said natural farming offers solution to some of the country's biggest problems. The government has decided to encourage natural farming in villages on the banks of Ganga, he said. This will not only make farms chemical-free but the Namami Gange campaign will also gain strength.

71% cannot afford healthy diet: Report

Seventy-one per cent Indians cannot afford a healthy diet and 1.7 million die every year due to diseases attributable to poor diet, according to a report released by the Centre for Science and Environment (CSE) and Down to Earth magazine.

The diseases attributable to dietary risk factors include respiratory ailments, diabetes, cancer, strokes and coronary heart disease, the report 'State of India's Environment 2022: In Figures' said.

The report refers to diets low in fruits, vegetables, whole grains, and diets high in processed meat, red meat, and sugary drinks.

"Seventy-one percent of Indians cannot afford a healthy diet. The global average is 42 percent," it said citing the Global Nutrition Report,



Adults aged 20 and above have only 35.8g of fruit per day as against the recommended 200g per day. They 168.7g of vegetables per day as against the minimum 300g per day.

The diet of an average Indian lacks in fruits, vegetables, legumes, nuts and whole grains. The consumption of fish, dairy and red meat is within target, it said.

A healthy diet is considered unaffordable when its cost exceeds 63 per cent of a person's income, according to the

Food and Agriculture Organisation.

The report also presents an analysis of food prices. It says that the consumer food price index (CFPI) inflation has seen a 327 per cent increase in the past year, while the consumer price index (CPI) - which includes CFPI - has seen an 84 per cent jump.

Rivers facing heavy pollution: CSE

Heavy toxic metals such as lead, iron, nickel present at alarming levels, says NGO

Three of every four river monitoring stations in India posted alarming levels of heavy toxic metals such as lead, iron, nickel, cadmium, arsenic, chromium and copper.

In about a fourth of the stations, which are spread across II7 rivers and tributaries, high levels of two or more toxic metals were reported.

Of the 33 monitoring sta-

of the 33 monitoring stations in the Ganga, 10 had high levels of contaminants. The river, which is the focus of the Centre's Namami Gange mission, has high levels of lead, iron, nickel, cadmium and arsenic, according to the State of Environment Report, 2022 from the environmental NGO, the Centre for Science and Environment (CSE).

The report is an annual compendium of environment-development data and is derived from public sources.

28 States. Of these, the Central Water Commission tested water samples from 688 stations for heavy metals between August 2018 and December 2020.

Of the 588 water quality stations monitored for pollution, total coliform and biochemical oxygen demand was high in 239 and 88 stations across 21 States – an indicator of poor wastewater treatment from industry, agriculture and domestic households.

India dumps 72% of its sewage without treatment. Ten States do not treat their sewage at all, as per the Central Pollution Control Board.

Coastline erosion

Over a third of India's coastline that is spread across 6,907 km saw some degree of erosion between 1990 and 2018. West Bengal is the worst hit with over 60% of its shoreline under erosion.

The reasons for coastal erosion include increase in frequency of cyclones and sea level rise and activities such as construction of harbours, beach mining and building of dams.

While the global average

of the Ocean Health Index, a measure that looks at how sustainably humans are exploiting ocean resources, has improved between 2012 and 2021, India's score in the index has declined over the same period, the CSE report underlines. India's total forest cover has registered a little over a 0.5% increase bet ween 2017 and 2021 though most of the increase has ta-ken place in the open forest category, which includes commercial plantations. This has happened at the cost of moderately dense for-est, which is normally the area closest to human habitations. At the same time, ve ry dense forests, which absorb maximum carbon dioxide from the atmosphere, occupy just 3% of total forest cover. India has a forest cover of

India has a forest cover of 77.53 million hectares. But recorded forests – the area under the forest department – are only 51.66 million. This gap of 25.87 million hectares – a size bigger than U.P. – remains unaccounted, the organisation noted.

New Delhi: India has figured at the bottom of the 2022 Environmental Performance Index (EPI) ranking of 180 countries, released by USbased institutions last week.

The US, the largest historical polluter is ranked 43rd, while the current bigges emitter China has been ranked at the 160th position. Denmark, the UK, Finland, Malta and Sweden occupy the top five slots, with countries from south and southeast Asia are placed at the bottom five.

The ranking is based on an assessment of 40 performance indicators, including climate change, biodiversity, sustainable agriculture, environmental public health and greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. India's lowest rank is attributed to its air pollution and rapidly rising GHG emissions.

Although the researchers claimed that most of the data used by them, were verified by a third party, the findings or such ranking practices are not fully accepted by the environment ministry in India, citing extrapolation of data and generalisation of conclusions that don't factor in national circumstances. The authors of the rankings claimed that they do not accept data that comes directly from the government.

Referring to low-scoring countries such as India, Myanmar, Vietnam, Bangladesh and Pakistan, the report said, "Most low scoring countries are those that have prioritised economic growth over sustainability, or those that are struggling with civil unrest and other crises. "India, with increasingly dangerous air quality and rising greenhouse gas emissions, falls to the bottom of rankings for the first time... China and India are projected to be the largest and second-largest emitters of GHG in 2050, despite recently promising to curb emissions growth rates."



He said that we have issued the first service license for LEO/MEO connectivity and hope to harness the technology to enable digital inclusion in remote areas.

Elaborating the role of new technologies in bridging digital divide, the Minister said that affordable broadband accessibility is the essence of digital inclusion. Developing 5G test bed, indigenous 4G and 5G stack, development of Indian 5G standards and setting up of 6G innovation forum are the initiatives to reduce cost, facilitate faster 5G spread in rural area and eliminate dependency on specific vendor. Turkish Foreign Minister Mevlut Cavusoglu has sent a letter to the United Nations formally requesting that his country be referred to as "Türkiye," the state-run news agency reported. The move is seen as part of a push by Ankara to rebrand the country and dissociate its name from the bird, turkey, and some negative connotations that are associated with it.

Anadolu Agency said Stephane Dujarric, spokesman to UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres, confirmed receipt of the letter. The agency quoted Dujarric as saying that the name change had become effective "from the moment" the letter was received.

President Recep Tayyip Erdogal's government has

President Recep Tayyip Erdogan's government has been pressing for the internationally recognized name Turkey to be changed to "Türkiye" (tur-key-YAY) as it is spelled and pronounced in Turkish. The country called itself "Türkiye" in 1923 after its declaration of independence.

In December, Erdogan ordered the use of "Türkiye" to better represent Turkish culture and values, including demanding that "Made in Türkiye" be used instead of "Made in Turkey" on exported products. 

INDIA'S GROWTH RATE slipped to a four-quarter low of 4.1% in the January-March period as a resilient post-pandemic rebound was disrupted by the Russia-Ukraine war that inflated prices of oil and other key commodities, and impeded the global supply chains.

Yet, in 2021-22, the country re-captured the fastest-growing major economy tag from China after a five-year gap, by reporting a gross domestic product (GDP) expansion of 8.7% in real terms, according to the data released by National Statistics Office (NSO) on Tuesday.

THE GOVERNMENT ON Tuesday raised the premium for its flagship insurance schemes, Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana (PMJJBY) and Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY), in order to make them economically viable.

The premium rate of PMJJBY has been revised upward to ₹1.25 per day, translating into an increase from ₹330 to ₹436 annually.

The annual premium for PMSBY has been hiked from ₹12 to ₹20, an official statement said. The new premium rates are effective from June 1, 2022. In percentage terms, the premium increase is 32% in case of PMJBY and 67% for PMSBY The decision has been

taken in view of the longstanding adverse claims experience of the schemes, it added.

The number of active subscribers enrolled under PMJJBY and PMSBY as on March 31,2022 were 640 million and 220 million, respectively. Since the launch of the PMSBY, an amount of ₹1,134 crore has been collected by the implementing insurers towards premium and claims of ₹2,513 crore have been paid as on March 31,2022.

Further, an amount of ₹9,737 crore has been collected by the implementing insurers towards premium and claims of ₹14,144 crore have been paid under PMJJBY as on March 31,2022.

Claims under both the schemes have been deposited into the bank accounts of the beneficiaries.

The Finance Ministry on Tuesday said that the Centre has released around ₹87,000 crore to

"This decision was taken to assist the States in managing their resources and ensuring that their programmes especially the expenditure on capital is carried out successfully during the financial year," Finance Ministry said in a statement. Further, it said this decision has been taken despite the fact that only about ₹25,000 crore is available in the GST Compensation Fund. "The balance is being released by the Centre from its own resources pending collec-

tion of Cess," the ministry said.

Now, only June payment is due and it would be the last one as compensation payment period is going to end on June 30, as prescribed under law. However, next meeting of GST Council may consider alternative to this as States are pressing for extending the compensation beyond June.

Assured compensation

With the introduction of GST, States were assured for compensation for loss of any revenue arising on account of implementation of GST as per the provisions of the GST (Compensation to States) Act, 2017 for five years. For providing compensation to States, Cess is being levied on certain goods and the amount of Cess collected is being credited to Compensation Fund. Compensation to States is being paid out of the Compensation Fund w.e.f. July 1, 2017.

Bi-monthly GST compensation to States for 2017-18, 2018-19 was released on time out of the Compensation Fund. As the States' protected revenue has been growing at 14 per cent compounded growth whereas the Cess collection did not increase in the same proportion, Covid-19 further increased the gap between protected revenue and the actual revenue receipt including reduction in cess collection.

In order to meet the resource gap of the States due to short release of compensation, the Centre has borrowed and released ₹1.1-lakh crore in 2020-21 and ₹1.59-lakh crore in 2021-22 as back-to-back loan to meet a part of the shortfall in cess collection. Now, cess collection would continue for some more time, but amount collected would be used for payment of principal and interest.

- Of this, Rs 25,000 crore is released from the GST compensation fund and the balance Rs 61,912 crore is being released by the Centre from its own resources pending collection of cess.
- Of the total compensation released, Rs 17,973 crore is towards April and May dues, Rs 21,322 crore towards February-March dues and Rs 47,617 crore is the balance of compensation payable up to January 2022.
- Goods and Services Tax (GST) was introduced in the country with effect from July 1, 2017 and states were assured of compensation for the loss of any revenue arising on account of implementation of GST for a period of five years.

Core industries grow 8.4% in April, a six-month high

Six of the 8 core industries remained in growth territory; strong show by coal and electricity sectors

New Belhi, May 3

Aided by strong show in coal and electricity sectors, the output of eight core industries grew 8.4 per cent in April, a six-month peak, much higher than the revised 4.9 per cent output growth recorded in March.

The latest print was, however, lower than 62.6 per cent growth seen in April 2021.


For the month under review, six of the eight core industries remained in growth territory. Only two sectors—crude oil (-0.9 per cent) and steel (-0.7 per cent) saw contraction. The other six industries that saw positive growth rate are coal (28.8 per cent); natural gas (6.4 per cent); refinery products (9.2

per cent); fertilisers (8.7 per cent); cement (8 per cent); and electricity (10.7 per cent).

The eight core industries have a weightage of 40.27 per cent in the Index of Industrial Production (IIP).

Meanwhile, the Commerce and Industry Ministry has revised upwards the final growth rate of core industries for January 2022 to 4 per cent from 3.7 per cent. Last month, the growth output of the core industries for December 2021 was revised upwards to 4.1 per cent, from 3.8 per cent.

Commenting on the latest numbers, Madan Sabnavis, Chief Economist at Bank of Baroda, told BusinessLine that core sector growth at 8.4 per cent for April is quite im-



pressive as it comes on a high base of 62.6 per cent.

"IIP growth (for April), too, can be expected to be in the higher single digit range of 6-8 per cent based on these growth rates for core sector," he added.

Some of the numbers are impressive like coal, which grew 28.8 per cent and power by 10.7 per cent, he said. This is difficult to reconcile with the power crisis that was there in April with shortage of coal and power being reported, according to Sabnavis. Evidently, this was not

the case, he added.

Aditi Nayar, Chief Economist, ICRA, said: "While the core sector growth rose to a 6-month high 8.4 per cent in April from 4.9 per cent in

March, benefitting from the constrained base of the second wave of Covid-19 in India, it trailed our forecast of II-12 per cent by a wide margin, dampened by a contraction in steel and crude oil."

Weak recovery

Sunil Kumar Sinha, Principal Economist, India Ratings and Research, said though coal and fertilisers recorded impressive annual growth in April, when against the pre-Covid level (February 2020), they still have some ground to cover as they are only 85.4 cent and 89 per cent of the pre-Covid level, respectively. Production of other core segments also just crossed the pre-Covid level indicating weak recovery across various infrastructure sectors. Ind-Ra expects the IIP growth at around mid single digits in April, he added.

GST mop-up dips 16% to ₹1.41 trn from April high

May numbers 44% higher than ₹97,821 crore seen a year ago

SHRIMI CHOUDHARY New Delhi, 1 June

The collection of goods and services tax (GST) fell short of the expected ₹1.5-trillion level in May, a month after hitting a record. The mop-up of ₹1.41 trillion in May is 16 per cent (₹26,655 crore) lower than the record collection of ₹1.68 trillion in April

However, the latest figure is 44 per cent higher than ₹97,821 crore a year ago. Also, the mop-up in May is still the fourth-highest since the inception of GST in July 2017.

The finance ministry released the provisional data on GST for May on Wednesday.


The sequential dip in the GST inflows in May was on expected lines, as the April GST collection was enhanced by year-end flows. At the same time, the high YoY growth reflects the low base of the second wave.

"The collections in May, which pertains to the returns for April — the first month of the financial year--has always been lesser than that in April, which pertains to the returns for March, the closing of the financial year," the ministry said.

"However, it is encouraging to see that despite being the first month of the fiscal, gross GST revenues have crossed $\mathop{\backslash} 1.40$ trillion — the third straight month since March," it added.

The newly-released GST figures pertain to transactions in April but tax collected in May.

Of the total mop-up in May, Central GST (CGST) stood at ₹25,036 crore, State GST (SGST) was ₹32,001 crore and Integrated GST (IGST) was ₹73,345 crore. This includes ₹37,469 crore from import of goods



and cess mop-up of ₹10,502 crore (including ₹931 crore from import of goods).

During the month, revenue from imports of goods were 43 per cent higher than the corresponding month last year. Collections from domestic transactions (including imports of services) was 44 per cent higher than the revenues from these sources in May 2021.

The number of e-way bills (one of the high frequency indicators) generated in April was 74 million, which is 4 per cent lower than 77 million e-way bills generated in the month of March.

Experts feels that a sustained momentum in the collection trend is likely to continue and may even exceed the budget estimates (BE).

India's goods exports in May increased 15.46 per cent to \$37.29 billion (year-on-year) driven by petroleum products, electronic goods and readymade garments, according to preliminary trade data released by the Commerce Department on Thursday.

The country's trade deficit more than trebled to \$23.3 billion in May, compared to a trade deficit of \$6.53 billion in May 2021, as imports during the month spiked 56.14 per cent to \$60.62 bil-

FY23 export target

India's goods export in April-May 2022-23 increased 22.26 per cent to \$ 77.08 billion while imports in the first two months increased 42.35 per cent to \$120.81 billion. Trade deficit for the period doubled to \$43.73 billion.

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The Commerce Department has not yet set an export target for FY23 due to an uncertain environment created by the Russian-Ukraine war. EPF deposits: FinMin approves 8.1% interest

New Delhi, June 3

The Finance Ministry has given its nod for 8.1 per cent rate on Employees' Provident Fund (EPF) deposits for fiscal year 2021-22. Now, this interest will be credited to accounts of over 6 crore RPF subscribers.

8.1 per cent rate of interest is lowest since 1977-78, when it stood at 8 per cent. In March, Central Board of Trustee (CBT), the apex body of EPFO recommended lowering the interest rate to 8.1 per cent from 8.5 per cent.

An office order, issued by the EPFO on Friday, said: "The Ministry of Labour and Employment has conveyed approval of the Central government to credit 8.1 per cent rate of interest for 2021-22 to each member of the EPF scheme."

Approval of Central government here refers to the



nod by the Finance Ministry. Now, after ratification, the EPFO would start crediting the fixed rate of interest for the fiscal into the EPF accounts.

In March 2020, the EPFO had lowered the interest rate on provident fund deposits to a seven-year low of 8.5 per cent for 2019-20, from 8.65 per cent in 2018-19.

The EPF interest rate provided for 2019-20 was the lowest since 2012-13, when it was brought down to 8.5 per cent.



IIM-A agri land price index for six states: Karnataka costliest

SANDIP DAS New Delhi, June 2

AGRICULTURE LAND IN Karnataka is the most expensive followed by Telangana, according to a new Agri Land Price Index (ALPI) launched for six states, including the two launched by the Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad (IIM-A) on Thursday.

The index, a prelude to a nationwide gauge to monitor farm land prices, was developed for 107 districts of Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh, benchmarking land prices for rural and semiurban areas.


The index is aimed at removing uncertainty in the agricultural land valuation.

IIM-A, in collaboration with digital agri-land market place SFarmsIndia, would record and monitor the data of prices of agricultural land in India. The index would act as a reliable source in terms of benchmarking land prices and help in potential conversion of agricultural land into real estate or for industrial use.

According to Prasant Das of IIM-A, the index would help the government in adopting more scientific measures for providing compensation for land acquisition besides helping financial institutions in underwriting of loan and insurance contracts. It would also ensure visibility in movement of agricultural land prices across the country.

As per the index, 34 districts in the six states are considered most expensive while land prices in 32 districts are referred to as 'median' and prices in the rest of the 41 districts are 'least expensive'.

According to the samples collected for developing ALPI, average agricultural land prices in Karnataka, Telangana and Andhra Pradesh, are reported at ₹0.93 crore, ₹0.81 crore and ₹0.77 crore peracre, respectively, while prices in Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu are ₹0.58



crore, ₹0.49 crore and ₹0.47 crore, respectively.

ALPI based on samples from at least 18 states will be developed in the next one year. This agricultural index is expected to offer better representation of the national context as well as offer a more granular index at regional levels.

"There is a surge in entrepreneurial interest in agricultural land and allied professions, this index will help in project planning," Das said. He also said that investors could use information in the index to assess the historical risk and return in the past and predict these metrics for the future to decide on their investment positions.

The Misra Centre for Financial Markets and Economy at IIM-A will host the index on its official website.

The country has around 200 million hectares of agricultural land and land acquisition for industrial use has become quite contentious because of lack of information of land prices in rural areas.



The PBOC and other regulators "will continue to resolutely push for the opening up of China's financial markets and further simplify the process of overseas investors coming into the Chinese market," it said in the statement.

SDRs are an international reserve asset that can be converted into five currencies. The yuan's entry into the SDR signaled it became one of the five global reserve currencies in 2016, after years of effort by Chinese authorities to promote its global use.

He said the company has tested a scaled-down prototype and expects to have its first cargo plane ready as early as next year. The cargo carrier is expected to be rolled out by February 2023, and the passenger version is expected by December 2024.

According to eVTOL.com, unlike conventional helicopters, which rely on internal combustion engines and mechanical transmissions to drive their large main rotors, eVTOL aircraft typically have multiple smaller propulsion units driven by electric motors. These propulsion units can be placed almost anywhere on an aircraft, a concept called distributed electric propulsion (DEP) or "power-by-wire." DEP enables tremendous design flexibility and unconventional configurations that were never possible before, eVTOL.com's note to investors said.


World Bank trims India growth to 7.5%

FE BUREAU New Delhi, June 7

THE WORLD BANK on Tuesday scaled down its FY23 growth forecast for India to 7.5% from 8% predicted in April, citing the damaging impact of rising inflation, supply-chain disruptions and the Russia-Ukraine conflict. These headwinds would offset "buoyancy in the recovery of services consumption from the pandemic", it said.

With this, the multilateral body has revised down its India growth projection for a second time since the Ukraine war began—it had cut its forecast by 70 basis points in April.

SBI revises economic growth forecast to 7.5%

Says elevated inflation in H1FY23 will mean nominal GDP growth of 16%

Mumbai, June 2

SBI Research has projected the Indian economy to grow at 7.5 per cent in 2022-23, an upward revision of 20 basis points from its earlier estimate.

As per official data, the economy grew by 8.7 per cent in FY22, net adding ₹11.8-lakh crore in the year to ₹147-lakh crore, the report said, adding this was however, only 1.5 per cent higher than the pre-pandemic year.

"Given the high inflation and the subsequent upcoming rate hikes, we believe real GDP will incrementally increase by ₹11.1-lakh crore in FY23," SBI chief economist Soumyakanti Ghosh said in a note on Thursday.

Nominal GDP expanded by ₹38.6-lakh crore to ₹237-lakh crore, or 19.5 per cent annualised.



The report expects RBI to be supportive of growth by gradually hiking reporates

In FY23 also, as inflation remains elevated in the first half, nominal GDP will grow 16.1 per cent to ₹275-lakh crore, he said.

Corporate growth

The report basis its optimism on the rising corporate revenue and profit and the growing bank credit coupled with ample liquidity in the system.

The report notes that in FY22, around 2,000 listed companies reported 29 per cent top line growth and 52 per cent jump in net profit over the previous year.

Similarly, the sector-wise data for April indicate credit offtake has happened in almost all sectors, led by personal loans registering 14.7 per cent demand spike and contributing around 90 per cent of the incremental credit. On the liquidity front, the report expects the central bank to be supportive of growth by only gradually hiking repo rates, but mostly frontload it in June and August with a 50 bps repo hike and 25 bps CRR hike in the forthcoming June policy.

Rate hike scenario

Core systemwide liquidity declined from ₹8.3-lakh crore in the beginning of the year to ₹6.8-lakh crore now while net LAF (liquidity adjustment facility) absorption declined from ₹7.5-lakh crore to ₹3.3-lakh crore. The RBI is likely to raise the reporate cumulatively by 125-150 bps over the pandemic level of 4 per cent.

RBI may also increase the CRR cumulatively by another 50 bps, which will lead to absorption of ₹1.74-lakh crore on durable basis.

Given the higher crude prices, the report sees inflation averaging at 6.5-6.7 per cent in FY23.

NARCL may rejig accounts on 1st list

National Asset Reconstruction Company (NARCL) may reshuffle its list of accounts for making binding offers because some of them may be nearing settlement or now have less visibility for resolution in a changing economic climate like price volatility.

While work related to the indicated amount (about ₹50,000 crore) remains on course, five-six accounts being considered for the first list may not be eligible for transfer, public sector bank executives said.

The situation is changing, especially in the light of volatility in metals.

An asset reconstruction company bases its calculations on the current situation and the potential for recovery.

NARCL has picked up five more accounts from the list of 50 for due diligence before deciding on making firm offers. The entity has missed the first deadline of March 31, 2022, for phase I, where about 15 accounts, totalling ₹50,335 crore, were expected to be transferred.

A total of 38 non-performing accounts, worth ₹82,845 crore, were identified for transfer to NARCL in phases.

Under the revised timelines, the company will make a binding offer in the first quarter, which ends on June 30, 2022 (Q1FY23). Together account from a list of 50.

First tranche of NPA transfer to NARCL in July

The first set of nonperforming assets (NPAs) of about₹50,000 crore are expected to be transferred to the National Asset Reconstruction Company (NARCL) in July with account-wise due diligence nearing completion. The remaining accounts are proposed to be taken over by NARCL by October-December. The details about the functioning of NARCL were discussed in a review by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Monday. The NARCL had identified 38 NPA accounts worth ₹82,845 crore, of which 15 NPAs worth ₹50,000 crore were to be transferred by March. **BS REPORTER**

Trade deficit widens to a record \$23.3 bn

New Delhi, 2 June

India's trade deficit widened to a record \$23.33 billion in May as imports grew at a faster pace compared to exports amid high commodity prices owing to the Russia-Ukraine conflict, the preliminary data released by the commerce and industry ministry showed on Thursday.


The previous highest monthly trade deficit was \$22.91 billion in November 2021. The deficit stood at \$6.28 billion in May last year.

Imports surged 56.14 per cent to \$60.62 billion in May on the back of a sharp jump in petroleum products amid rising global crude oil prices. The share of petroleum products in India's total imports was 30 per cent in May, growing 91.6 per cent year-on-year to \$18.1 billion. Gold imports witnessed a 759 per cent jump to \$5.8 billion; electronic goods rose 28.5 per cent to \$5.44 billion; and coal imports grew by 2.6 times to \$5.3 billion in May.

India's merchandise exports grew 15.46 per cent YoY to \$37.29 billion in May. Export growth fell by 7.2 per cent compared to last month, after witnessing record outbound shipments of over \$40 billion in March and April.

Of the top 10 major commodity





groups covering 81 per cent of the total exports in May, all sectors except plastics, cotton yarns, and fabrics continued to rise. Engineering goods, petroleum products, gems and jewellery, organic and inorganic chemicals were top exported products.

Insurers' capital needs under PMJJBY eased 50%

SUBRATA PANDA Mumbai, 3 June

he Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (Irdai) has reduced the capital required by insurance companies offering policies under Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana (PMJJBY) by almost 50 per cent.

This is to enable insurers to offer more policies under the scheme, and provide financial security to the bottom-of-the-pyramid segment in India.

This is, perhaps, one of the first times that the insurance regulator is providing such a dispensation to insurance companies. "In order to facilitate more partici-

"In order to facilitate more participation of insurers under PMJJBY, Irdai has reduced the capital required to be held by insurers offering PMJJBY, by almost 50 per cent," Irdai said in a statement.

The easing of capital requirements by Irdai will accelerate the penetration of life insurance in India. It will support the life insurers in achieving their target set by the government, the regulator further said.

PMJJBY provides life insurance cover worth \$2 lakh to all account holders aged 18-50 years. According to government data, the number of active subscribers enrolled under PMJJBY as of March 31, 2022, is 64 million. The claims ratio (percentage of amount of claims paid to premium earned) for PMJJBY was 145.24 per cent as of March 31, 2022. About \$9,737 crore has been collected as premium under the scheme while claims of \$1.4,144 crore have been paid.

Earlier this week, the Centre increased the premium rates for PMJJBY and Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY), for the first time in seven years due to "long-standing adverse claims experience", and to make them economically viable.

The premium for PMJJBY would increase from ₹330 to ₹436 a year effective June 1, and the PMSBY premium would rise from ₹12 to ₹20.

"The PMJJBY has been a loss-making scheme for most life insurance companies. The revision of premium rates is a welcome move and makes PMJJBY a lot more viable. Earlier, life insurance companies earned ₹289 (net of commission) for renewals per-

taining to PMJJBY. Post revision in premiums, companies will earn ₹425 from renewals.

Also, reinsurance support for PMJJBY was muted. Thus, the entire risk was on the life insurance companies' balance sheet. Now, with Irdai reducing the requirement for this scheme, it will free up capital for life insurance companies," said Rushabh Gandhi, Deputy chief executive officer (deputy CEO), IndiaFirst Life Insurance.

The move to reduce capital under PMJJBY is going to free up capital to the tune of over ₹500 crore for the insurance companies, experts pointed out.

According to an expert, for PMJBY policies, the required solvency margin (RSM) is a sum of 0.1 per cent of sum at risk plus 1 per cent of mathematical reserves. The sum at risk factor has been brought down to 0.05 per cent now.

"The premium increase for PMJJBY will bring the much-needed relief to insurance companies because the mortality experience has been on the higher side. This is especially in the last two years because of Covid.

Now, with Irdai reducing the capital requirement, it will free up some capital for the insurers. This is because we do not have to block as much capital as we had to earlier," said Vighnesh Shahane, managing director (MD) & chief executive officer (CEO), Ageas Federal Life Insurance.

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According to Nilesh Sathe, former Irdai member (life), "The increase in premium will help the insurance companies in reducing their losses under PMJJBY. This is because out of \$330 collected by banks, the amount reaching insurance companies was \$289 for offering insurance coverage of \$2 lakh.

The premium was just not enough and insurance companies were bleeding. The relaxation in capital requirement will mean that some of the capital of insurance companies will get freed up and the pressure on solvency will also go down."

"It is unlikely that these products will be marketed aggressively by insurance companies because the sale of these products depends on the banks. Insurance companies, which are promoted by banks or which have tie ups with banks, are only selling PMJJBY policies. So, the government should encourage the banks to aggressively sell this product since the buyers of PMJJBY are essentially bank customers," he added.

bank customers," he added. Experts said that Life Insurance Corporation (LIC), SBI Life and IndiaFirst Life Insurance are some big players offering policies under the PMJJBY scheme.

"This is a stepping stone towards improving ease of doing business in the insurance sector by moving from the current regime requiring prior approval for launching the products, to a regime where products

could be launched without prior approval,"

The initiatives will enable the insurance industry launch suitable products in a timely manner.

Innovative products

policyholders to address the dynamic needs of the market.

According to the circular sent to insurers, they are required to put in place the board-approved policy of products that are to be offered or modified/revised.

The board-approved policy should also comply with certain norms specified in the circular, and the same should be complied at the time of launching the products or their modification/revision.

The Product Management Committee of the insure must ensure compliance to the policy of the board while signing of the new products or modification of products, said the circular.

Commenting on the initiative, Tapan Singhel, MD and CEO, Bajaj Allianz General Insurance, said: "The proactive initiative by the IRDAI will provide some necessary mechanisms to insurance companies that wish to bring out more innovative products in the market at a faster frequency."

Provisioning norms for NBFC-UL specified

THE RESERVE BANK of India on Monday specified the provisioning that non-banking financial companies (NBFCs), classified as the upper layer, must maintain for some categories of standard assets. According to the regulations, these NBFCs will need to make provision of 2% on standard assets for housing loans disbursed at teaser rates. The new norms on standard asset provisioning will come into effect from October 1. Currently, systemically important NBFCs make standard asset provision at a flat rate of

The RBI introduced provisioning for standard assets after 2011 and by March 2015, the provisioning needed to be 0.25% of outstanding assets.

Teaser loans attract lower interest rates in initial years after which rates are reset higher. The rate of provisioning will decline to 0.4% after a year from the date on which the rates are reset.

For commercial real estate loans for projects other than residential ones, provisions on standard assets have been set at 1% of the outstanding amount. Loans disbursed for office buildings, retail space, multi-purpose commercial premises, industrial or warehouse space, hotels or land acquisition will fall under this category.

Loans for which the recovery in the case of a default will depend on cash flows arising from such properties will also be included under this category.

The rate of provision for commercial real estate loans for residential housing stands at 0.75% of the outstanding amount. For projects which have commercial and residential parts, the commercial area must be Standard asset provisioning for NBFC-ULs

less than 10% of the total floor space index (FSI). For all individual housing loans and loans to small and micro enterprises (SMEs), such NBFCs will have to make provision of 0.25% for standard assets. For all other loans, the rate of provision is 0.4% of the outstanding amount.

The RBI has issued the rules on standard asset provisioning as part of the framework for scale-based regulation for NBFCs. In April, the central bank had tightened capital requirements norms and introduced rules on the large exposure framework. In October 2021, the RBI introduced the scalebased regulatory structure for NBFCs.

To expand scope of digital payments; adds a credit line to payment channel

In a move that will add to the growing popularity of the Unified Payments Interface, the Reserve Bank of India has proposed linking of credit cards to UPI.

"To begin with, the Rupay credit cards will be linked to the UPI platform," RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das said on Wednesday, adding that this will provide additional convenience to users and enhance the scope of digital payments.

At present, UPI facilitates transactions only by linking savings/current accounts or through debit cards. The new facility will allow users to link UPI to their credit cards, too. This feature will be available once the system development is complete, RBI said, adding that instructions will be

MDR rate unclear

issued to NPCI separately.

However, it is not clear how the merchant discount rate (MDR) will be charged for UPI transactions through credit cards. At present, there is zero MDR on UPI and Rupay debit card payments.

At the post-MPC press conference, RBI Deputy Governor TRabi Sankar said that talking about the pricing structure will be "jumping the gun".

"The basic objective of linking credit cards to UPI is to provide the customer a wider choice of payments. How the pricing will work out, we will have to see because pricing is something that banks and other entities will have to do. At this point, we will introduce the arrangement," he said.

Line of credit

Experts said the linking of UPI to credit cards would introduce a line of credit to the payment channel.

"The addition of RuPay credit cards adds a credit line facility to UPI. Having a choice of payment benefits both the merchant and the customer, as now the UPI payment can be done using a RuPay credit card without the merchant having a card-enabled POS terminal," said Pranay Jhaveri, Managing Director - India and South Asia, Euronet Worldwide.

"While UPI has allowed a large section of the population to adopt digital payments, credit on

UPI hasn't played out very strongly in the past, despite some attempts being made on it. Since credit cards are the most widely used credit instrument used in India, this new development will boost

credit access in the country," said Shashank Kumar, CTO & Co-founder, Razorpay, adding that this is a significant move for small businesses in tier-II cities and beyond.

"If this takes off, we would have 10x merchants accepting credit cards in India in a few years," he said. UPI has become the most inclusive mode of payment in India with widespread user adoption. At present, over 26 crore unique users and 5 crore merchants have been onboarded on the UPI platform. In May, 594.63 crore transactions totalling ₹10.40-lakh crore were processed via UPI.

RBI retains FY23 GDP growth forecast at 7.2%

FE BUREAU New Delhi, June 8

THE RESERVE BANK of India (RBI) on Wednesday kept unchanged its FY23 real economic growth projection for the country at 7.2%, indicating that risks are more or less evenly balanced since its April forecast.

It now projects the real GDP growth in Q1 at 16.2%; Q2 at 6.2%; Q3 at 4.1%; and Q4 at 4%. The projection seems to have factored in a waning favourable base effect with the passing quarter of this fiscal. The central bank had refrained from revising either its GDP growth projection or inflation forecast in May, when it announced an out-of-cycle repo rate cut of 40 basis points.

Stating that economic activities are gaining traction, the

central bank suggested that rural consumption would benefit from brightening farm prospects following the forecast of a normal monsoon season. Similarly, the on-going recovery in contact-intensive services will likely bolster urban consumption. Investment, too, could be aided by improving capacity utilisation, the government's capex push and rising credit flow. Growth of both merchandise and services exports is expected to sustain the good momentum.

"(However) spill-overs from prolonged geopolitical tensions (Ukraine war), elevated commodity prices, continued supply bottlenecks and tightening global financial conditions nevertheless weigh on the outlook," the RBI said on a day when it raised the repo rate by 50 basis points, to curb runaway inflation that hit an eight-year high of 7.79% in April.

RBI to enhance recurring payment limit to ₹15,000

The system is by and large prepared for tokenisation, says RBI Deputy Governor

Mumbai, June 8

In a boost to customer convenience, the Reserve Bank of India plans to enhance the limit for recurring payments to ₹15,000/ transaction from ₹5,000. Hence, recurring payments up to ₹15,000 will not require an additional factor authentication such as OTP.

"Requests have been received from stakeholders to increase the limit under the framework to facilitate payments of larger value like subscriptions, insurance premia, education fee," said RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das on Wednesday in the monetary policy statement.

The move will further augment customer convenience and leverage the benefits available under the framework, he said, adding that necessary instructions to the effect will be issued shortly.

The current framework for on processing of e-mandate-based recurring payments provides for an additional factor of authentication (AFA) during registration, sending a pre-debit notification, enabling subsequent recurring transactions to be executed without AFA, and an easier avenue to withdraw such mandates.

Additional benefits

Benefits of convenience, safety and security are available to users, Das further said, adding that the system, too, also benefits from users' confidence. Till date,



over 6.25 crore mandates have been registered under this framework, including those for over 3,400 international merchants.

International merchants are also working on the framework, but could take some time.

RBI Deputy Governor T Rabi Sankar said about 3,450 international merchants have registered.

"Some of them, for whom India business is not that significant will take a little longer to make the investments, to adjust their systems. Some major ones hav communicated that to us, that they will adjust but will take little bit longer," he said at th post MPC press conference.

Experts said the higher limit of \$15,000 will ensure ease for cutomers in case of high-value recurring payments.

Card tokenisation

The RBI also expressed satisfaction over the progress made be the industry for card tokenisation, the deadline for which is lune 30.

"With about three weeks to go the progress has been satisfact ory. Over the last several months our teams have been constantil discussing with all stakeholder to ensure that the process o tokenisation is implemente smoothly. The system is by an large prepared," said RBI Deput Governor T Rabi Sankar.



RBI hikes limit for real estate loans by co-op banks

SHASHANK DIDMISHE Mumbai, June 8

THE RESERVE BANK of India on Wednesday doubled the amount of loans that urban cooperative banks (UCBs) can issue for housing. The revision is done in order to factor in the rise in house prices.

The central bank has permitted cooperative banks to extend doorstep banking services to their customers. "This will enable UCBs to meet the needs of their customers, especially senior citizens and differently abled," the RBI said.

Additionally, rural cooperative banks can issue loans for residential housing projects. The cap on loans that these banks can issue is 5% of their total assets. The move measure will improve credit flows from the cooperative banks to the housing sector, the RBI said.

"The big announcement was raising the limit of loans for the State Co-operative Banks and District Central Co-operative Banks to the housing sector. The housing sector is a

Maiden dividend

Sheryl Sandberg, the No 2 executive at Facebook-owner Meta, who helped turn its business from start up to digital advertising empire while also taking blame for some of its biggest missteps, is stepping down.

Sandberg has served as chief operating officer at the socialmedia giant for 14 years. She joined from Google in 2008, four years before Facebook went public.

"When I took this job in 2008, I hoped I would be in this role for five years. Fourteen years later, it is time for me to write the next chapter of my life," Sandberg wrote on her Facebook page on Wednesday. Sandberg has led Facebook's advertising business, and was responsible for nurturing it

from its infancy into an over \$100 billion-a-year power-house. As the company's second most-recognised face—after CEO Mark Zuckerberg—Sandberg has also become a polarising figure amid revelations of how some of her business decisions for Facebook helped propagate misinformation and hate speech.

Not done enough, say some

As one of the most prominent female executives in the tech industry, she was also often criticised for not doing enough both for women and for others harmed by Facebook's products.

Reacting to her decision to call it a day, Zuckerberg wrote on his Facebook page: "It's the end of an era. When Sheryl joined me in 2008, I was only 23 years old and knev anything at company. Sh our ads business, mied great people, forged our management culture, and taught me how to run a company. She created opportunities for millions of people around the world, and she deserves the credit for so much of what Meta is today.

"I'm going to miss running this company with Sheryl. But I'm glad that she'll continue to serve on our board of directors. Looking forward, I don't plan to replace Sheryl's role in our existing structure. I'm not sure that would be possible since she's a superstar who defined the COO role in her own unique way."

He said he would continue to helm affairs at the bank until a replacement is found.

No fixed timeline

"There really is no timeline for my stepping down, but normally one year is a decent timeline", he said, adding that it could get completed within one year to 15-months.

The bank's board has begun the process to select a new MD and CEO, and will form a search committee soon.

Vasudevan's announcement on May 19 to step down had surprised analysts and investors.

The bank's scrip has since fallen and touched a 52-week low of ₹40.30 apiece on the BSE on Tuesday.

Because the bank is a listed entity, the moment he informed the board of his intent to step down, it had to be disclosed to the exchanges.

"It is price sensitive information. It can't be held back by the board," he said.

Vasudevan noted that the

situation is unique as he has decided to step down voluntarily.

"If you look at the private sector banks for the last few years, the only time the MD and CEO of a bank left is either because they had completed 70 years of age or there was an issue." he said.

Good position

He further stressed that the bank is in a good position with strong growth plans and that is why he decided to take the plunge at this point of time.

"A change at the top should not have any impact on the bank," he said, adding that the merger of Equitas Holdings with Equitas SFB will not be impacted.

Even as the music world was struggling to come to terms with the passing of Pandit Shivkumar Sharma, the news of the demise of another santoor legend, Pandit Bhajan Sopori (1948-2022), on Thursday came as a rude shock.

Pt. Sopori died of cancer in a Gurugram hospital. He is survived by his wife and two sons. His legacy will be carried forward by his younger son Abhay

Hailing from a musician's

family that nurtured the Shaivite, Sufi, and Hindustani classical traditions in Kashmir for generations, Pt. Sopori led the revival of Sufi and folk music in the State to spread the message of humanism. He remained positive even when the insurgency engulfed his home district of Sopore, and kept organising events at the grassroots.

While the world called him the Saint of Santoor, Pt. Sopori, a Padma Shri winner, often described himself as a cultural bridge between Kashmir and the rest of In-

dia, and called santoor a living symbol of national integration.

Using music as a balm to heal the wounds and bring the youth in the Kashmir Valley to the mainstream, Pt. His vast repertoire has compositions derived from Naats (Islamic devotional songs) and Vedic chants. He drew his inspiration from the fountain of saints like Lalleshwari and Gani Kashmiri.

Born in Srinagar, Pt. Sopori inherited the Sufiana tradition of santoor from his great grandfather Shankar Pandit and grandfather Samsar Chand Sopori. His father, Shambhu Nath Sopori, who was called the father of music in Jammu & Kashmirintroduced Pt. Sopori to the family instrument at a young age.





The road to the ICCMen's T20 World Cup in 2024, scheduled to be held in the US and the West Indies, will kick off in June with the first set of qualifying events emanating from Europe.

This will be the start of the pathway towards the biggest Men's T20 World Cup, which is set to feature a record 20 teams.

The eight top-performing teams at the Men's T20 World Cup 2022 in Australia along-side hosts USA and West Indies will automatically qualify for the 2024 edition of the marquee tournament. The next highest-ranked teams in the ICC Men's T20I Team Rankings as of November 14, 2022 will make

up the 12 automatic qualifying spots.

The remaining eight spots will be decided by the regional qualifier events - two teams from each of Africa, Asia and Europe will qualify for the event, while the Americas and EAP regions will each have one team progress to the World Cup. THE UNITED STATES has regained a coveted speed crown in computing with a powerful new supercomputer in Tennessee, a milestone for the technology that plays a major role in science, medicine and other fields.

Frontier, the name of the massive machine at Oak Ridge National Laboratory, was declared on Monday to be the first to demonstrate performance of one quintillion operations per second — a billion billion calculations — in a set of standard tests used by researchers to rank supercomputers. The US Department of Energy several years ago pledged \$1.8 billion to build three systems with that "exascale" performance as scientisticallist.

cale" performance, as scientists call it.
But the crown has a caveat. Some experts
believe that Frontier has been beaten in the
exascale race by two systems in China. Operators of those systems have not submitted
test results for evaluation by scientists who
oversee the so-called Top500 ranking.
Experts said they suspected that tensions
between the United States and China may
be the reason the Chinese have not submitted the test results.

"There are rumours China has some-

thing," said Jack Dongarra, a distinguished professor of computer science at the University of Tennessee who helps lead the Top500 effort. "There is nothing official."

Supercomputers have long been a flash point in international competition. The room-size machines were first built for cracking codes and designing weapons, but now also play major roles in developing vaccines, testing car designs and modeling climate change.

The field was dominated by US technology for decades, but China has become a dominant force. A system there called SunwayTaihuLightwas ranked the world's fastest from 2016 to 2018. China accounted for 173 systems on the latest Top500 list, compared with 126 machines in the United States.

Japan has been a smaller but still potent contender. A system called Fugaku, in Kobe, took the No. 1 spot in June 2020, displacing an IBM system at Oak Ridge.

Frontier gives that top position back to the lab. The system, built by Hewlett Packard Enterprise using two kinds of chips from Advanced Micro Devices, was more than twice as fast as Fugaku in the tests used by the Top 500 organisation.

"It is a proud moment for our nation," saidThomas Zacharia, directorof Oak Ridge, at an online briefing from an industry event in Germany. "It reminds us we can still go after something that is bigger than us."

Building the system, composed of 74 cabinets that each weighs 8,000 pounds, was made more difficult by the pandemic and problems obtaining components in the supply chain crisis, Zacharia said. But he predicted that Frontier would swiftly have a major impact in studying the impact of Covid and aiding the transition to cleaner energy sources, for example.

Chinese researchers used to participate in the ranking process. But the country has adopted a lower profile in promoting its supercomputer progress as the United States has taken a series of steps to slow China's technology advances — including by making it harder for some Chinese companies to acquire the foreign chips that can be used to make supercomputers. — NYT

- The US has retaken the top spot in the world supercomputer rankings with the exascale Frontier system at Oak Ridge National Laboratory (ORNL) in Tennessee.
- The Frontier system's score of 1.102 exaflop/s makes it "the most powerful supercomputer to ever exist" and "the first true exascale machine," the Top 500 project said Monday in the announcement of its latest rankings.
- Exaflop/s (or exaflops) is short for 1 quintillion floating-point operations per second.



At 83, Japanese man becomes oldest to sail solo across Pacific

AN 83-YEAR-OLD Japanese adventurer returned home Saturday after successfully completing his solo, nonstop voyage across the Pacific, becoming the oldest person to reach the milestone.

Kenichi Horie arrived in the Kii Strait off Japan's western coast, completing his trans-Pacific voyage in 69 days after leaving a yacht harbor in San Francisco in March. It was the latest achievement for the octogenarian adventurer, who in 1962 became the first person in the world to complete a solo nonstop voyage across Pacific from Japan to San Francisco.

Sixty years later, he traveled the opposite route. "I just crossed the finish line. I'm tired," he wrote in his blog after reaching Japan in the early hours of Saturday.

He said his sailing boat, Suntory Mermaid III, was to be toed after the sunrise for an expected arrival at his home port of Shin Nishinomiya yacht harbor in the evening. Reports said a welcome event will be held Sunday.

His achievement came after three days of struggle with the pushback from a strong tide. He wrote in his blog Friday that he succeeded but was exhausted and took a nap after feeling assured that his yacht was now on the right track to the finish line. Horie's return to Japan makes him the world's oldest person to complete a solo, nonstop crossing of Pacific, as per his sponsors. AP

The Chilika Lake, Asia's largest brackish water lagoon, has 176 fishing cats, according to a census done by the Chilika Development Authority (CDA) in collaboration with the Fishing Cat Project (TFCP).

This is the world's first population estimation of the fishing cat done outside the protected area network.

According to the CDA, phase 1 of the estimation was conducted in 2021 in the 115 sq.km marshland in the north and north-eastern section of Chilika and its surrounding areas. Phase 2 was conducted in 2022 in the Parikud side along the coastal islands of Chilika.

A total of 150 camera traps were deployed in two phases with each fixed in the field for 30 days. Spatially explicit capture recapture method was used to analyse the data, the CDA said in a statement.

'Participatory spirit'

"It was truly participatory in spirit since local fishermen and villagers of Chilika were the primary participants in this exercise. Without their support, the world's first such population estimation outside protected areas on this globally threatened cat, would not have been possible," said Susanta Nanda, Chief Executive Officer, CDA.

"Ten graduate and postgraduate students also

volunteered during the exercise. Chilika Wildlife Division staff actively facilitated and participated in the estimation. Such a participatory effort involving multiple stakeholders for studying this elusive and threatened species sets a wonderful precedent," said Partha Dey, co-founder, TFCP.

The CDA said the globally threatened cats are found in wetlands in major South and Southeast Asian river basins starting from the Indus in Pakistan till the Mekong in Vietnam and in Sri Lanka and Java. They are found in 10 Asian countries but have stayed undetected in Vietnam and Java since the last decade or so.

"Wetlands in Asia are being lost at alarmingly rapid rates and proper data on their current status or even baseline data are missing. The status of many wetland species remains understudied and highly threatened. Tracking specialist species such as the fishing cat gives us an indication of what might be happening to these ecosystems, which are safeguards against climate change and droughts," said Tiasa Adhya, the co-founder of TFCP.



Liquid mirror telescope in Devasthal sees first light

Once trained using AI tools, the telescope can help track transients such as supernovae, space debris and meteorites

The four-metre International Liquid Mirror Telescope (ILMT) saw the first light recently, gazing out from its vantage on Devasthal, a hill

in Uttarakhand, into the

deep sky.

The telescope, staring at the sky overhead, will make sky surveys possible and obtain images that can help observe transient phenomena such as supernovae and record the presence of space debris or meteorites – basically, watch the skies.

The telescope has been

built by a collaboration of scientists from Canada, Belgium and India. It is located at an altitude of 2,450 metres on the Devasthal Observatory campus of the Aryabhata Research Institute of Observational Sciences (ARIES) in Nainital district, an autonomous institute under the Department of Science and Technology, Government of India.

A large pool of mercury placed in a vessel is spun around so fast that it curves into a parabolic shape. Since mercury is reflective, this shape helps in focusing the

reflected light. A thin sheet of mylar protects the mercury from the wind.

"It was thrilling to see the formation of the primary mirror. Nearly 50 litres of mercury, weighing close to 700 kilograms, is spun hard to form a paraboloid mirror of just 4 mm thickness and a diameter of about 4 metres," says Kuntal Misra, Project Investigator at ARIES. She has worked in this project since January 2020.

First image

The first image made by the telescope consisted of several stars and a galaxy, NGC 4274, which is 45 million light years away.

The telescope, having a primary mirror that is liquid, cannot be turned and pointed in any direction. It "stares" at the zenith and watches the sky as the earth rotates, thereby giving a view of different objects.

This property can be used to scan and survey the sky, observe transients and moving objects such as meteorites.

It will work in tandem with the existing 3.6-metre Devasthal Optical Telescope.

Once it starts making observations, the telescope will collect gigabytes of data, which will need to be analysed using artificial intelligence and machine learning (Al and ML) tools.

"In a night's observation, it will make thousands of images which cannot be analysed by just looking at them. We will need to develop and train AI and ML tools to do this," says Dipankar Banerjee, Director of the ARIES Observators.

With the monsoon expected soon in the area, the real observations may start only in October, after the rains, according to Dr. Banerjee.

IISc ranked world's best research varsity

Regaining the pole position among public and private institutions from the country, the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) Bangalore was ranked at 155th place in the latest QS World University Rankings.

The premier institute also continued to prove its mettle in quality research, as it emerged as the global leader in the citations per faculty (CpF) indicator in the latest rankings. According to the indicator, when universities are adjusted for faculty size, IISc is the world's best research university. It achieved a perfect

score of 100/100 on this metric. Further, as the fastest rising South Asian university on the QS rankings' top 200 list, IISc gained 31 places year-onyear (YoY), up from 186th posi-

tion last year.

The nineteenth edition of the international university rankings by global higher education analysts QS (Quacquarelli Symonds) featured 41 Indian universities, of which 12 improved their rankings, 12 remained stable, 10 saw a decline and seven were new entrants.

This year's QS World University Rankings is the largest ever, with 1,418 institutions across 100 locations, up from 1,300 last year. Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) finished a record-extending 11th consecutive year as world number one. The University of Cambridge rose to second place, while Stanford University remained in the third position.

Following IISc were some of the leading Indian Institutes

of Technology (IITs), all of whom improved their standing, while IIT Indore debuted at 396th rank (*see box*).

Among declared public institutions of eminence, while IISc, IIT Bombay, IIT Delhi, IIT Madras and IIT Kharagpur attained a higher rank, University of Delhi and University of Hyderabad saw a decline while Banaras Hindu University's rank remained unchanged. On the other hand, two of the declared private institutions of eminence maintained the same rank—Manipal Academy of Higher Education and Birla

Institute of Technology and Science (BITS) — while O. P. Jindal Global University (JGU) rose to the next band of 651-700.

JGU is not only India's top ranked university with a focus solely on social sciences, arts and humanities but also the only Indian non-STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) and non-medicine university to find a place in the QS World University Rankings 2023.

Among new entrants, University of Madras debuted in the 541-550 band, while Chandigarh University debuted in the 801-1,000 bracket as the youngest varsity, having been established less than 10 years ago.

IIT Guwahati (37th for CpF), IIT Roorkee (47th for CpF) and the University of Madras (48th for CpF) are also among the global top 50 research institutions.

In terms of other indicators, the University of Calcutta (801-1,000) recorded the highest percentage of female students (63 per cent), followed by the University of Mumbai (1,001-1,200) with 57 per cent. Amity University (1.001-1.200), on the other hand, employed the highest percentage of female faculty (58 per cent), followed by the University of Mumbai (56 per cent).

However, India continues to struggle in indicators such as institutional teaching capacity and QS' internationalisation metrics. Thirty of India's 41 ranked universities have suffered decline in its Faculty/Student Ratio (FSR) indicator, with only four recording improvements. Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham (1,001-1,200)

is the best-performing local institution for the proportion of international faculty, ranking 411th globally, while Amity University (1,001-1,200) is the national leader for the proportion of international students as it ranked 542nd globally.

According to QS Senior Vice President Ben Sowter, while the latest edition of the rankings reflects the excellent work that several Indian varsities are doing to improve their research footprint, the dataset also suggests that the Indian higher education sector still struggles to provide adequate teaching capacity.

India's score up to 35, IISc among top in world: Kovind

INDIA'S TALLY in the QS rankings has risen to 35 this year from 29 in 2021, President Ram Nath Kovind said Tuesday. According to the rankings, the Bengalurubased Indian Institute of Science (IISc) has scored 100 on the research parameter and joined the league of elite global institutions, he added.

The 2023 edition of the QS or Quacquarelli Symonds world university rankings will be released Thursday.

Speaking at the inauguration of the two-day Visitor's Conference of vice-chancellors of central universities and directors of institutions of national importance, Kovind said improving the quality of institutions of higher learning is of vital importance in order to achieve the larger goals in the education sector.

"We should be setting benchmarks for the best in the world. In the top 300, there are six institutions (from India) this year as against four last year (in QS rankings)," Kovind said.

"I am especially happy to note that the Indian Institute of Science has got a full score of 100 on the research parameter and shares this distinction with eight highly reputed institutions of the world, including Princeton, Harvard, MIT, and Caltech," he added.

QS Ltd CEO and MD, Nunzio Quacquarelli, was present at the launch of the conference, which was also attended by Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan and UGC chairperson Prof M Jagadesh Kumar.

Prof Kumar made a presentation on the phase-wise roll out of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, including the decision to encourage Indian and foreign universities to tie up for twinning, dual-degree and joint degree programmes from the 2023-24 academic session.

The UGC chairperson said that the commission has reached out to 600 foreign universities and 63 foreign envoys posted in India to achieve greater collaboration in the higher education sector.

He also said that the government was working on a plan to launch a "One Nation One Subscription" scheme for universities to provide students access to high quality journals.
